What are the different types of veneers?

You can ask your dentist about both pros and cons of veneers. Find out what are the things and various veneers they offer and suggest.

Porcelain veneers

Porcelain veneers are one of the most common and used materials for veneers. Moreover, this material is translucent and gives realistic results. They also have a reputation for long duration and build quality because they can last for ten or more years in most cases. With good dental practices such as brushing and flossing, veneers may last for 20 years.



Composite veneers

Composite veneers are made of resin-based composite and are commonly used veneers. They may have less durability as compared to porcelain veneers and may last for five or more years. However, composite veneers are more economical as compared to porcelain.

Composite veneers require a highly skilled dentist; in contrast, porcelain requires a great lab technician for a proper finish.

No-prep veneers

No-prep veneers don't require preparation time on your teeth before they get installed. They will help improve the aesthetic appearance of your teeth while saving your teeth enamel as much as possible.

Furthermore, this process is less invasive and takes less time as compared to other veneer materials such as lumineers, durathin veneers.

Who is a perfect candidate for veneers?

Veneers provide an excellent appearance to your front teeth. If you have stained, fractured, or knocked teeth, you should consider visiting a [Houston veneers specialist](#) for the best dental appliance. Veneers are good for you if:

- Chipped and knocked
- Discolored or stained
- Fractured, Undersized, and non-uniform teeth

However, they are not for severely damaged teeth. In such conditions, your dentist will recommend a dental crown to save your teeth in both ways functionally and aesthetically.



How long do dental veneers last?

The benefits of crowns and veneers depend upon various factors, such as location, dental visits, and type of material.

There are several types of crowns, but they are basically for damaged teeth or if you have a large cavity. They cover the whole tooth and provide both an aesthetic and functional look. Moreover, they are made of several substances such as:

- Porcelain
- Metal
- Composite resin
- A composite resin and the combination of various materials

But the crowns are thicker than veneers, and **Houston uptown dentists** need to trim more parts of tooth enamel. Though crowns cover your whole teeth and prevent further cavities and erosion, also veneers cover only eight teeth to provide a better appearance.
