Who is the right candidate for veneers?

Veneers are a good option for a wide range of people, including those who have teeth that are too badly discolored to be corrected by simply bleaching them, or for people who have teeth that are broken, chipped, or cracked and need to have their teeth concealed to correct the problem. **Veneers Houston** are also a great option for people who have teeth that may be the right shade of white and undamaged but are unevenly spaced or just uneven period. What are dental veneers and how are they prepared?

Dental veneers are a thin shell covering over your natural teeth that look like your natural teeth- only a better version of them. **Veneers for Straight Teeth** can be made from a few different types of materials including porcelain and a composite resin material. And they are made in a dental lab by a technician based on modeling from your teeth so they will fit over your natural teeth snugly and adhere permanently in place with adhesive.

Porcelain Vs Composite Resin:

There are pros and cons to both types of material used for **Dental Veneers in Uptown** and which one you prefer will depend on your personal needs and preference.

Porcelain:

- Porcelain is the more expensive option coming in at anywhere from \$1,000 to \$2,500 per tooth but on the upside, these expensive cosmetic covers can also last anywhere from ten to fifteen years with the proper care and oral hygiene.



- Porcelain does have the disadvantage of staining easier from drinks such as coffee, tea, or cola. And these are the same staining drinks that likely caused your natural teeth to become discolored in the first place so you may want to discuss how to properly take care of your cosmetic improvements beforehand so that you don't end up damaging your dental veneers with your old habits.

Composite Resin:

- The other option is made from a resin composite and they cost less usually around \$250 to \$1,000 per tooth but unlike porcelain, the lifespan on composites is shorter-

usually only five to seven years. However, if you are strapped for cash and your insurance won't cover the cost the composites look good and they are a viable option to improve your smile.

- The advantage to composite however is the fact that despite their low-end cost and short lifespan, they don't stain easily which means even for their short life span they won't become easily discolored.
