What is the bonding?

Dental bonding, sometimes called teeth bonding or composite bonding, is a cosmetic dentistry treatment used to enhance a smile.

During the procedure, your dentist will use tooth-colored resin to modify the affected teeth' size, shape, or color.



Benefits of teeth bonding

- Bonding is a minimally invasive process that usually involves no tooth modification.
- Most patients, even young patients with broken or chipped teeth, are eligible for treatment.
- The process just requires one visit to complete.
- Most of the time, an anesthetic is not required.
- In comparison to many other cosmetic procedures, bonding is less expensive.
- There is no need for downtime.

What are veneers?

Veneers are tooth-colored overlays applied to the front surfaces. Technicians create them using high-quality dental materials, such as tooth-colored composite or porcelain.

Dental veneers are cosmetic in nature. They can hide numerous visual flaws, such as gaps, chips, cracks, and discolored teeth.

Benefits of Veneers:

- Because porcelain is translucent and white, it lends veneers a realistic gloss that bonding cannot duplicate.
- Ceramics are stain-resistant.
- Almost instantly, veneers produce a stunning, white, uniform grin.
- They can live up to 20 years in total.

- **Treatable concerns:** Dental bonding and veneer procedures can address the same cosmetic issues. However, veneers may be a better option for correcting more obvious concerns.
- **Tooth preparation:** Our dentists must remove a small amount of enamel from your teeth to allow porcelain veneers to blend seamlessly with your smile. Dental bonding does not require tooth preparation.
- **Material:** Dental bonding is performed using tooth-colored composite resin. Porcelain veneers are unique, customized restorations created by a laboratory from durable ceramic. The ceramic is strong and resists staining.
- **Cost:** Veneers are made of porcelain and typically cost more than the material used for bonding teeth. Because veneers are permanent, they can save you money over time compared to bonding, which can break or eventually need to be replaced. If you want to hide stains that professional teeth whitening

- **Appearance:** The goal of veneers and bonding is to match the surrounding teeth's color as closely as possible. However, veneers are stain-resistant, unlike bonding resins, which can darken over time. Cosmetic bonding is more useful for chipped or damaged teeth because it can be shaped like clay to fit your tooth.
- **Durability:** Dental veneers are built for durability, lasting anywhere from 10 to 25 years. Although not invincible, porcelain is more durable than dental bonding resins. Again, depending on the needs of your teeth, bonding is still a strong material that can be used to repair teeth.
- **Goal:** Dental bonding and veneers may be the best options, depending on what you want to improve. If you want whiter teeth, try professional teeth whitening first. If you are unsatisfied with the results, veneers may be your next best option.
