

Do You Need a Root Canal?

A root canal treatment is a process that includes cleaning out the decay in the pulp chamber. The hardest part of your teeth is called dentin.

Your teeth have a three-layer enamel, dentin and pulp chamber. The core of your teeth contains dental pulp, nerves, blood vessels and connective tissue. What is a root canal?

A root canal treatment is like a drill, clean and fill. During this treatment, your dentist will:

- Extract the bacteria or decayed part from the tooth pulp, root and nerve.
- Distinct your teeth area with antibiotics
- Fill the empty root canal.
- Seal the area with the sealant to prevent new decay.

A dentist or a specialist can do a root canal treatment to save nearby nerves. But it makes the tooth more fragile; a dentist recommends a dental crown after the treatment. Also, [root canal recovery time](#) is very less compared to other dental treatments.

What are the signs and symptoms of root canal infection?

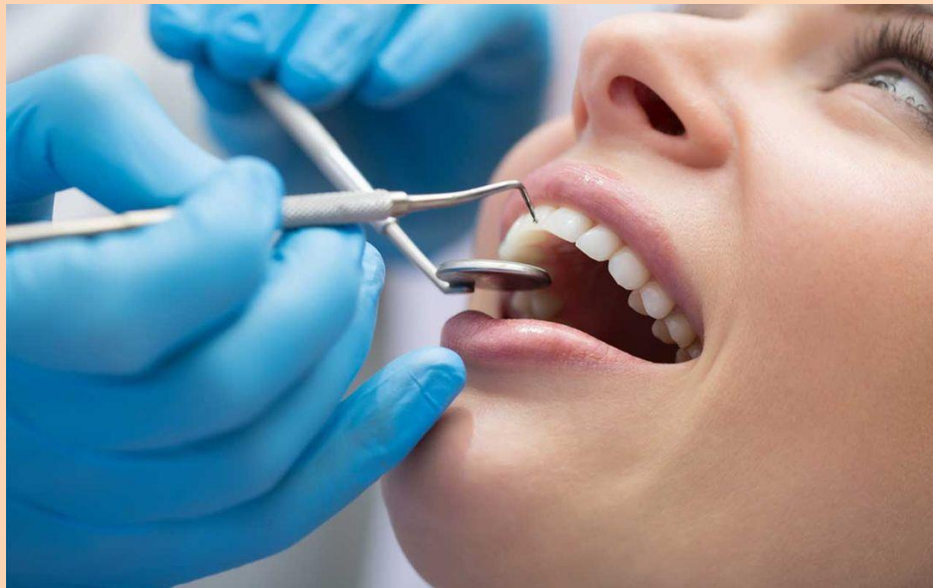
The only way to know a root canal infection is to visit a dentist, who will perform various tests and examinations, but several warning signs must be considered.

If you find any of these signs, you should consider seeking a dentist as soon as possible—the sooner you visit the dentist for treatment, the more chances you save them.

Persistent pain.

Persistent tooth pain indicates that you may need a root canal procedure. The pain in your teeth might bother you constantly or go away from time to time, but it returns. You may feel deep pain in the bone of your teeth, face, or jaw. Tooth pain may have been caused by a root canal or other dental issues, including

- A cavity
- Gum disease
- The pain referred from a sinus infection
- Damaged dental appliances
- Impacted teeth



Regardless of your pain, it would be best if you considered contacting a dentist to know what is best for you. They may recommend a thorough diagnosis.

Sensitivity to heat and cold

Do your teeth hurt when you eat warm food or cold drink? Or perhaps your teeth feel sensitive when you have ice cream or drinks. The sensitivity could feel like an adult ache or a sharp pain. If your tooth is infected, this may result in blood vessels and nerve damage.

Tooth discolouration.

A tooth infection in your pulp may cause your teeth to discolour. Even the trauma to your teeth or the breakdown of internal tissue can damage the roots of your teeth and make them appear black.

Conclusion
