- pain
- swelling tissues around the gums
- tenderness,
- redness of gum tissue,
- unpleasant smell or taste in your mouth
- discharge of pus in the area

- difficulty opening the jaw (trismus),
- difficulty swallowing (dysphagia),
- jaw spasms
- fever,
- loss of appetite, and
- feeling unwell.

These are the signs that spread the infection into the throat and neck, which could affect the ability to breathe, swallow and pain and could be life-threatening.
