

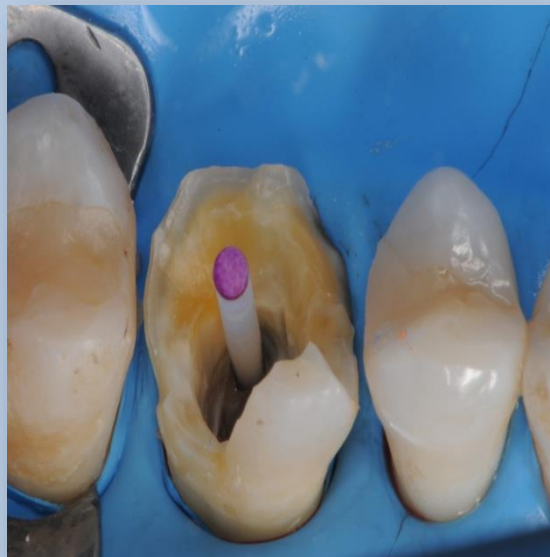
How Are Broken Or Chipped Tooth Repaired?

Do you have a chipped, cracked, or broken tooth? Teeth damage can occur for many reasons; you had a fall or bite mishap. However, the enamel that covers your teeth is the strongest tissue in your body, but it has limits. It can still break or chip.

If you have a broken or chipped tooth, there is no need to worry. There are many options to **Fix Chipped Teeth**, and your dentist will fix them with the best option for you.

Why Is a Dental Crown Needed For broken Teeth?

If you have a broken tooth or tooth decay, your dentist will file the affected area of the tooth, and then the crown comes. After removing the tooth decay, the dentist will use the crown to cover the teeth, keep them safe from infection, and improve their appearance. Your dentist will place the [Temporary Crown](#) on your teeth until the permanent one is ready. They are made from porcelain, composite resin, or ceramic. All the materials have different benefits.



The dentist may perform root canal therapy and implant a pin or a post in the canal, then build up enough of a framework on which a crown can be created if the whole top surface of the tooth is broken off but the root is still undamaged. The crown can then be attached to the hook or post-retained restoration by the dentist.

Typically, a dental crown needs two visits to the dentist, and your dentist will take X-rays to examine the tooth roots and bone.

If there is no other problem, your dentist will numb the surrounding area of the tooth and remove the impacted part of the tooth to make space for the crown. If the tooth has a large amount of chipping, the dentist will use a filling material to fix it so it can hold the crown.

After making the **chipped tooth filling** and putting it to make an impression of the tooth, place the crown. The dentist sends the impression to the dental lab to create the crown.

How to take care of a Chipped or Broken Tooth?

If you have a chipped or broken tooth, contact your dentist and visit as soon as possible. If left untreated, it can cause the teeth more damage and become more infected, or you may lose your teeth.



Therefore, until your appointment, the following self-care measures you should take;

- If you have a painful tooth, take acetaminophen or another over-the-counter pain reliever or ask your dentist. Take salt water and rinse your mouth with it.
- Suppose the broken tooth has a sharp edge that can hurt your tongue. You can cover it with wax paraffin or sugarless chewing gum until you visit your dentist.
- If you are hungry and can't chew, you must eat soft foods and avoid biting down on the broken tooth.

Once you visit your dentist, your dentist will see how much your teeth have chipped and broken and how severely it is damaged. Depending on your case. If you have severe damage to the teeth, the more [Chipped Tooth Repair Cost](#) the procedure will be.
