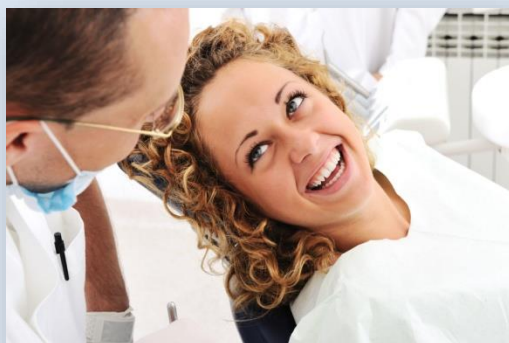

Your [orthodontist miami](#), first roughens the tooth's surface before applying a liquid that allows the bonding agent to adhere to the tooth. After shaping or molding the tooth with the composite resin over the liquid, your dentist hardens the substance using ultraviolet light.

Why there's a need for dental bonding?

Dental bonding can fix a fault or imperfection within the tooth. An [orthodontist in Aventura Florida](#) uses dental bonding to improve a cracked, decayed, or discolored tooth. The process also helps in closing small gaps between teeth. Dental bonding can increase the length of your tooth. For instance, if one of your teeth is shorter than the others, you'd like them to all be the same length.

Bonding is a quick process that doesn't involve any downtime. You can continue your daily activities after the surgery if you don't require an anesthetic. Bonding teeth typically takes 30 to 60 minutes. Depending on the complexity of the treatment, certain appointments might take longer.

Are there any major complications in teeth bonding?

There's no major complication in dental bonding. It's important to remember that the composite resin used in this procedure isn't as durable as your natural teeth. The material has a possibility of chipping or detaching from your natural tooth. However, crowns, veneers, or filling are less likely to chip or crack. If you bite your nails, chew on pens or pencils, consume hard foods or sweets, or chew on ice, your bonded tooth may chip.



You could get some discoloration if you smoke or drink a lot of coffee.
