

What Are the Steps of the Root Canal Procedure?

Suppose your tooth is severely damaged or suffering from an infectious bacteria. In that case, you should visit your dentist immediately to save your teeth. After diagnosis, the dentist will recommend a [Root Canal Near Me](#). This procedure involves several steps and includes properly cleansing dead cells from your teeth. Here are the main stages of **Root Canal Houston**;

Steps of a root canal treatment near me

Root Canal Treatment Houston is a relatively simple procedure. In this, your dentist cleans infectious parts of your teeth like dead pulp and fills your canal with sealant. After it, you need a dental crown to increase the durability and longevity of your teeth.



Preparing the area

Initially, your dentist uses anesthesia to numb the infected site and surrounding area with the injection in your gums and tooth roots. Once the area is numbed, they will place a dental dam in your mouth, isolating the infected area from the rest of your mouth.

Accessing and cleaning the roots

Then, the dentist makes an opening by drilling your teeth to expose the infected area and pulp chamber. Then your dentist uses dental instruments to clean out your teeth' pulp chamber and dead roots with the help of antibacterial and antiseptic solutions. This eliminates the further chance of any bacteria left.

Shaping the canals

After that, the dental team reshapes your canal with the help of tiny dental instruments, so teeth get ready to receive the filling material.

Filling the canals

Your dentist places rubber-like material, called gutta-percha, inside the canal and uses UV light to fasten the reaction. Later, they will compress the filling to fit snugly against the wall and add white, adhesive cement to seal the canal.



Filling the access hole

The filling material prevents further infection to your teeth and saves them from teeth eruption. They might need to place a post in a canal to strengthen your tooth. This is only necessary if your teeth are severely damaged and cannot support restoration on their own.

Healing and antibiotics

After the whole procedure, your dentist will prescribe you some painkillers and antibiotics to kill the rest of the infections. Also, the dentist will instruct you on post-care instructions. It's normal to experience discomfort after a few days of the procedure. Some over-the-counter pain medication usually relieves the discomfort.

Crown placement

If the roots were on the back of your teeth and had significant damage, the patient needs to return for a crown. Your dentist will place a crown around your treated area to protect it and add more durability. Your crown is made of the same teeth-like material, and they will blend the shade of teeth.
