What Is Involved in Getting a Dental Implant?

The first step is the dental implant development of an individualized treatment plan. The plan addresses should address your problem and then your dentist will address an oral surgery to restore the aesthetic and functionality of your teeth.

Next, Your dentist places the tooth root implants, a tiny post made of titanium, in the bone socket of missing teeth. As the jawbone heals, your teeth bone grows around the implanted post and sincerely anchors your jaw. The healing process can take upto three to four months.
