

# How is the Full Mouth Restoration Procedure Works?

A **full mouth restoration** procedure is also known as reconstructive dentistry. This form of dentistry includes a number of different procedures that are designed to fix broken teeth, replace teeth that are missing, replace old dental work that has worn out, re-construct jaws, get rid of diseases, and any other procedure that is needed for a complete mouth restoration.

There are different techniques that are used in this form of dentistry. A combination of techniques is also often used. Some of them include cosmetic, implant, and orthodontic procedures, oral surgery, and neuromuscular dentistry.

## **Choosing the Right Professional**



If you are planning to undergo any dental treatment, it is necessary to be very comfortable with your dentist. Your dentist needs to understand what you want and you should be able to ask any question or concern that you may have without being nervous. Ideally, look for someone who has had a lot of experience in the field of mouth restoration. You should also look for a professional [best dentist near me](#), who is close to your home or place of work so that the dental clinic is easily accessible. Another important factor to consider is whether your dentist will accept your specific dental insurance plan if you have any.

## Ideal Candidates for the Procedure

**Full mouth restoration** is usually targeted at people who have extensive damage in their mouths and problems that affect most of the teeth as well as the gums and surrounding tissue. It is also important that the person should be strong enough to receive local or general anesthesia. This procedure is also more ideal for younger candidates who will be able to recover from it quickly and adapt to the new material in the mouth. Older candidates are usually advised to go in for less invasive procedures.



## Dental Implants

**Dental implants** are much more natural-looking, and they leave the person feeling like they did when they had their natural teeth. The implants are placed against the jawbone so that the jawbone can actually fuse to them. Once this fusion has occurred these implants are rigid and that allows them to hold the false teeth into position so that they do not slip, move or float.

People with **dental implants near me** eat normally, they laugh without fear of their teeth moving, and they smile bigger. They have more confidence and are better satisfied with the work they have had done. The drawback is that the titanium rods have to be surgically placed against the jawbone, and then the person has to allow enough time for the bone fusion to take

place. Some implants cannot be loaded until this fusion is complete, and some implants can be immediately loaded.

### **Financing the Procedure**

The cost of a [full mouth restoration](#) procedure can be quite high. This is because there are different kinds of materials and a lot of advanced equipment that is used. There are also a lot of additional costs to the procedure like fees for the anesthesia, lab fees, and other additional expenditures.

The professional fees also have to be added to this amount. And if a specialist is going to perform the treatment, there might be additional charges for that too.
