

What is a Root Canal Procedure?

A root canal is a restorative treatment to save a severely damaged or infected tooth. Due to significant decay, several dental procedures on a tooth, big fillings, a crack in the tooth, or chipped or broken enamel, the nerve and the pulp of a tooth may become irritated, inflamed, and infected. Moreover, trauma to the face is another factor that might cause it.

The tooth's nerve and pulp are removed during a root canal treatment, and the interior is cleaned and sealed. Without treatment, an abscess could develop when the tissue around the tooth becomes infected. Therefore you should consider visiting a dentist for regular Teeth Cleaning Dentist Near Me.



After a tooth has broken and knocked through the gums, the nerve is no longer crucial to the tooth's health and function. Its sole purpose is sensory: to convey a sense of heat or cold. The lack of a nerve won't impact your tooth's functionality.

Is It Necessary to Remove Tooth Pulp?

A tooth's pulp or nerve tissue breaks down when it is damaged, and germs start to grow in the pulp chamber.

Germs and other decaying material can bring on an infection or abscessed tooth. An abscess is a pus-filled pocket that develops at the end of a tooth's root. An abscess results when the infection extends over lots of the tooth's roots. Additionally, an infection in a tooth's root canal might result in the following:

- Swelling that could move to the head, neck, or other parts of the face
- Bone loss near the root's tip Drainage issues that spread from the root.
- A hole may develop through the cheek with drainage into the skin.

What Indicates a Need for a Root Canal?

There are specific indications that you could require a [Root Canal Houston](#):

- Persistent tooth sensitivity, particularly to heat or cold
- Acute discomfort during eating or biting
- Your gums are inflamed.
- Teeth with cracks or chips, uncomfortable or swollen gums
- Darkened gums or severe rotting

A dentist specializing in treating disorders and injuries to the dental pulp, or the tooth's nerve, is an endodontist. Your general dentist could advise that you visit an endodontist if your root canal could be more complicated.

What are the complications associated with root canals?

Infections can return after a root canal. Among the most likely explanations for this are:

- More root canals than is typically anticipated in a tooth (leaving one of them uncleaned). Therefore you should ask a dentist about [Dental Sealants For Child](#) to save their teeths.
- An unnoticed break in a tooth's root
- A repair flaw that has made it possible for microorganisms to pass it into the inner tooth
- A breakdown of the sealing material due to time, allowing bacteria to recontaminate the inner tooth
