The implant is held firmly in place over the course of several months by the bone surrounding it, which develops. The gap is then filled with prosthetic teeth connected to the implant using a metal connector.



What are the Types of dental implants?

There are two major kinds of **Single Tooth Implant**:

Endosteal dental implants

The most prevalent kind of dental implant is endosteal. Typically, they look like tiny screws, and Endosteal implants are comprised of biocompatible substances like titanium.

Endosteal implants are replaced with dental roots by being surgically placed deep within the jawbone. One or more teeth can be secured with one implant.

Subperiosteal implant

This type of implant is employed when there is insufficient healthy jawbone to support an endosteal implant. While subperiosteal implants are placed beneath the gum line, the jawbone is not drilled for them. They don't go within the bone; they are inserted above or on top.

Timeline and recuperation after surgery

Getting a dental implant involves several steps and takes between three and nine months. Before your treatment is finished, you could require the assistance of multiple other dental specialists, such as an oral surgeon and a periodontist.

Evaluation period

Get your teeth, gums, and jawbone examined as the initial step. Determining whether you have sufficient healthy jawbone to support the implant is a crucial component of this first assessment.

Before starting the dental implant process, a bone graft or other operation may be advised if your jawbone is too thin or soft. Furthermore, there must be no periodontal disease in your gums.

Dental implants can replace one or more teeth. The kind and extent of **Dental Implant Surgery Houston** can anticipate depends on how many teeth you want to be replaced.
