

What Are Dental Dentures?

If you have a missing or gap between teeth, you may consider [affordable dentures near me](#) as a replacement. There are two types of dental dentures available complete and partial dentures. Complete dentures are used when you don't have single teeth left, while partial dentures are for some teeth missing.

Complete Dentures

Complete teeth dentures are either traditional or immediate. Your dentist uses conventional dentures after 8 to 12 weeks when you lose teeth, and your gums start healing.

Unlike traditional dentures, your dentist makes immediate dentures in advance and palace them as soon as your teeth remove. As a result, patients do not have to wait for the healing process; however, bones and gums shrink after tooth removal. Immediate dentures are treated as a temporary solution because they need more adjustment than traditional dentures.



Partial Dentures

A removable partial denture or bridge consists of particular teeth attached to a pink or gum-color base. Sometimes it is connected with metal frameworks that hold and fixes dentures in your mouth.

Your dentist recommends **partial dentures near me** when one or more natural teeth remain in the upper or lower jaw. They place fixed bridges by replacing or adding dental crowns on either side of the space and attach artificial teeth to them. Not only does a partial denture fills the gap or missing teeth, but it also prevents changing teeth position. Are There Alternatives to Dentures?

Dental implants dentures are one of the best alternatives for dentures and support cemented bridges. They provide the same look and functionality as natural teeth but are expensive. Furthermore, not everyone is eligible for dental implants because they require enough bone density and gums.

Does Insurance Cover the Cost of Dentures?

Most dental insurance providers cover the whole cost of dentures. However, you should contact your insurance provider to know what they will cover.

Procedure

You need several dental visits and a few weeks for appointments. Initially, your dentist will thoroughly diagnose your mouth to know what appliance is best for you. Here are some general steps of the whole procedure:

- Your dentist makes a series of impressions on your lower and upper jaw and adjusts them to ensure a proper bite.
- Then they create models and plastic patterns in the exact shape and position of the dentures.
- They will ask you to wear them several times to ensure comfort, body, and color before casting the final denture.
- Cast a final denture and make necessary adjustments



What Do New Dentures Feel Like?

You might feel a little different or odd for a few weeks until your cheek muscles and tongue adapt and learn to keep them in place and make you comfortable. Also, there are a few problems associated with dentures for the initial days as minor irritation or soreness occurs,, and salvia flow may increase; these problems will subsidies as your mouth adapts.
