

# What Is A Dental Bridge?

If you have missing teeth, the [dentist that do implants near me](#) can close the gap by applying dental bridges to save your smile. A bridge is a false tooth called a pontic placed by the abutment teeth to both sides. However, Pontic is made of a variety of materials, such as gold they're made from porcelain which gives an aesthetically pleasing look.

## What are the types of dental bridges?

There are four main types of dental bridges:

- Cantilever
- Traditional
- Maryland
- Implant-supported



## What is the Traditional dental bridge?

A traditional dental bridge consists of a Pseudo tooth or is held with the help of cemented crown by each abutment tooth.

This type of bridge is the most popular and can be used when you have some natural teeth on both sides of the gaps.

### **Cantilever dental bridge.**

Cantilever dental bridges are very similar to conventional bridges, and a dentist fixes the Pontiac in dental bridges with the help of cement to one abutment. You only need one tooth next to the missing or gap between the teeth.

### **Maryland dental bridge**

They are very similar to traditional bridges; these types of bridges are between two natural teeth, one on each side of the gap. But a traditional bridge uses crowns on the abutment teeth, and Maryland bridges use a framework made of metal or porcelain bonded to the back of abutment teeth.

Like a conventional bridge, a Maryland bridge can be used when you have an original tooth on both sides of the gap caused by the missing tooth.

### **Implant-supported dental bridge**

As the name suggests, they are supported by [full mouth dental implants](#) to supposed the crown and frameworks. Dental implants are typically surgically placed for every tooth, and these implants hold a bridge position. If one dental implant for each missing tooth isn't possible, then the bridge is applied by your dentist.



They are the strongest and most stable system and mainly require two surgeries to attach to your teeth.

- One to embed the dental implant in your jaw bone
- A second [Dental Implants Surgery](#) to place a dental bridge
- It can take numerous months for the procedure to find the procedure.

## **Dental bridge vs. dental implant**

Many dental insurance plans cover dental bridges, and many now cover implants as well. You need to replace the dental bridge after every 5 to 15 years, and you also need to maintain dental hygiene. Some factors can reduce the life of dental bridges, like dental hygiene and dirty teeth, and you should also avoid hard food.

## **Conclusion**

Your replacement teeth are very similar to natural teeth and feel normal. Suppose you maintain daily brushing and flossing at least twice a day.
