Before placing a dental implant, someone who has lost a tooth may require a bone graft. It is valid even if you want a dental implant the day after losing a tooth. As the graft heals, you shouldn't have any pain, and when it's over, you'll be ready to get dental implants. Most people will need to have a **dental bone graft** or bone transplant as the initial step before enjoying their new replacement tooth.

What happens after the procedure of bone grafting?

Additionally, your dentist must wait for the bone graft to integrate with the existing natural bones in your mouth. Unfortunately, because every mouth is unique, it is impossible to say with certainty when this will occur.

The time it takes for the bone graft to integrate with your mouth's native bones might range from three months to a full year. You have to visit your dentist for regular check-ups until they decide whether you are ready for implants or not.
