- Whenever oral hygiene routines are not maintained.
- When using adhesives for a prolonged time, particularly when going to the dentist, is uncommon, and when using adhesives more frequently and in more significant amounts. These changes might point to the necessity for new or adjusted dentures.
- When there is a known allergy to a component in the adhesive.



## How Are Adhesives for Dentures Used?

Consider the following advice when using denture adhesives:

- Use the least quantity when required to deliver the most significant benefit. Apply a smaller amount you believe you'll need, then gradually increase it until you're comfortable.
- Spread the glue evenly across the denture's tissue-supporting surface.
- Apply or reapply as required to achieve the desired result.
- Always use a very clean denture while applying the adhesive.
- Recall that properly fitting dentures are optimal when using adhesives.
