Mission : Write the corresponding letter for each place on the list.

- Magnificent Mile* : A small part of Michigan Avenue between Oak Street at the north and the Chicago River at the south. It is one of Chicago's major tourist destinations and the largest shopping district in the city.
- Sears Tower (Willis Tower)* : It became the tallest building in the world in 1973 and it held the title for nearly 25 years. It is currently the third-tallest building of the United States.
- Tribune Tower* : It is a neo-gothic skyscraper built between 1923 and 1925. The tower is the home of the Chicago Tribune newspaper.
- Adler Planetarium* *Ohio Street Beach* *Grant Park*
- Carbide and Carbon building* : Built in 1929, this skyscraper was turned into a hotel in 2004. The exterior is covered in polished black granite and the tower is dark green with gold leaves.
- Field Museum* : A natural history museum *Chicago Theatre* : Built in 1921
- Wrigley Building* : Located on the Magnificent Mile, this skyscraper was built to house the corporate headquarters of the Wrigley Company that produces chewing gum.
- Navy Pier* : Chicago's most visited tourist attraction with its Ferris wheel.
- John Hancock Observatory* : It has a 360° view of the city, up to four states and a distance of over 80 miles (130km) .
- Art Institute of Chicago* *Buckingham Fountain* *BP Bridge*
- Cloud Gate* : Nicknamed **The Bean** (= *le haricot*), this public sculpture by Indian-born British artist Sir Anish Kapoor.
- Crown Fountain* : A video sculpture in Millennium Park.
- James R. Thompson Center* : This postmodern building houses offices of the Illinois state government. The sculpture at the front entrance is by the French artist Jean Dubuffet.
- Jay Pritzker Pavilion* : This **bandstand** (= *kiosque à musique*) in Millennium Park is the home of the Grant Park Symphony Orchestra and Chorus.
