


Let's visit Boston!

Mission : Write the corresponding letter for each place on the list.

- Freedom Trail* : It is a 4km brick-marked **path** (= *un chemin*) through downtown Boston that passes by 16 locations significant to the history of the United States.
- Paul Revere House* : This original three-story house was built around 1680 and it is the oldest house in downtown Boston. It was the colonial home of American patriot Paul Revere during the time of the American Revolution.
- USS Constitution* : A three-masted frigate of the United States Navy. She is the world's oldest naval vessel still afloat. The name "Constitution" was chosen by President George Washington.
- Tea Party Ships and Museum* *Museum of Science*
- Bunker Hill Monument* : This obelisk was erected to commemorate the Battle of Bunker Hill, which was one of the first major battles between British and Patriot forces in the American Revolutionary War.
- John Hancock Tower* *Old North Church* *Colonial Theater*
- Boston Massacre Site* : The place where a confrontation between British soldiers and Boston civilians occurred in March 1770.
- Faneuil Hall* : A marketplace that first opened in 1743. It is sometimes referred to as "**the Cradle of Liberty**" (= *le berceau de la liberté*).
- Boston Common* : Dating from 1634, it is the oldest city park in the United States.
- Copp's Hill Burying Ground* : This cemetery was founded in 1659.
- North End* : The city's oldest residential community, where people have continuously inhabited since the 1630s. It is known for its Italian American population and restaurants.
- Massachusetts State House* : It is the state capitol and seat of government for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Its dome is covered with **copper** (= *du cuivre*).
- Old South Meeting House* : This church was built in 1729 and was the organizing point for the Boston Tea Party .
