



facts about the linden tree



I was curious and looked up facts about juniper seeds.



1. There are many linden species in Lithuania, but the only one that grows by itself is Mažalapė linden.
2. Linden loves moist and fertile places, so it grows in forests, parks and homesteads.
3. July flowers bloom in June and July.
4. It is not difficult to see in the summer of July - it has lime blossoms that are well known to everyone. Lime flowers have a nut and yellow petals - "wings". Two linden seeds are stored inside the nut.
5. The fruit of July (nut) ripens at the end of summer or beginning of autumn. During the winter, the seeds are carried away by the wind.
6. When the wind blows, the "wings" fly away together with the nut and thus the lime seeds spread.
7. Linden seeds are very nutritious, they are used in the same way as hazelnuts or walnuts. The seeds of the linden yield an oil with a quality close to that of olives and a taste similar to almond oil.
