Four seasons game



Summary

This is a classroom game to learn about the different seasons and the changes that occur during each season. It is addressed to kindergarten and year 1,2 students.

Resources

- **Picture cards:** You can find pictures online or take your own pictures to use in the game. You will need to gather or print a set of picture cards that depict various items and scenes commonly associated with each season.
- **Worksheet with four columns:** You can create a simple worksheet with four columns labeled "Spring", "Summer", "Autumn", and "Winter".
- **Scissors and glue or tape:** To sort the picture cards, the children will need scissors and glue or tape to attach the cards to the worksheet.
- **Pencils:** Each group will need a pencil to label their worksheet.
- **Printer or copier:** To print the worksheet and picture cards.

Additionally, it's important to have a pre-game lesson on the four seasons and the changes that occur during each season, this will help the children understand the game and have a deeper understanding of the subject.

Preparation

- 1. Gather or print picture cards: Find or take pictures that depict various items and scenes commonly associated with each season, and print or gather a set of picture cards.**
- 2. Create a worksheet: Create a simple worksheet with four columns labeled "Spring", "Summer", "Autumn", and "Winter".**
- 3. Prepare the materials: Cut out the picture cards and make sure each group has a worksheet and a set of picture cards, scissors, glue or tape, and a pencil.**
- 4. Review the lesson on the four seasons: Before playing the game, have a pre-game lesson on the four seasons and the changes that occur during each season. This will help the children understand the game and have a deeper understanding of the subject.**
- 5. Set up the game area: Make sure you have enough space for the children to work in small groups.**
- 6. Plan for the group discussion: Decide how you want to facilitate the group discussion, and make sure you have enough time for each group to present their findings and for the whole class to discuss the different seasons and the changes that occur during each season.**

Activity.

1. Print or gather a set of picture cards that depict various items and scenes commonly associated with each season (e.g., snow, leaves changing color, flowers blooming, etc.).
2. Divide the children into small groups.
3. Give each group a set of picture cards and a worksheet with four columns labeled "Spring", "Summer", "Autumn", and "Winter".
4. The groups must sort the picture cards into the correct column, based on which season they think the picture represents.
5. Once all the groups have sorted their cards, have them share their answers and discuss the different seasons and the changes that occur during each season.
