Project Overview

The project will collaborate with organizations like The Voluntary Forest Protection of South Ymittos (EDNY), promoting environmental awareness and empowering students to support the IB principles of "Sharing the Planet" through hands-on experiences and learning.

Project Objectives

Environmental Awareness and Education:

- Engage students in learning about local flora, fauna, insects, and animals, fostering an understanding of the interconnectedness between ecosystems and human actions.
- Promote the significance of environmental conservation and the role of volunteer organizations in preserving natural habitats.

Active Participation and Volunteerism:
