

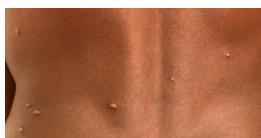


## Mpox info

### What are the signs of Mpox?



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Skin lesions often occurring  
on the body



Swollen lymph nodes  
in the neck or groin



Fever



Muscle  
aches

### How do you get Mpox?




Contact with  
monkeypox skin  
lesions or scabs




Sharing linens,  
personal hygiene  
items, eating utensils




## What if I am not sure?

 **Consult a doctor or go to a CeGIDD (centre for free information, screening and diagnosis)**




**Isolate for 3 weeks if monkeypox is confirmed**




**Protect others, wash your hands and keep skin lesions covered**

## How can I protect myself?

 **Avoid physical contact, including sex, with an infected person**

 **Do not share your things with an infected person (linens, personal hygiene items, eating utensils)**

 **Mpox vaccine for those considered at high risk of infection**
