Types Of Dental Bridges:

Traditional bridges:

These involve making a crown for a person's implant or tooth on both sides of the tooth that is missing, with the pontic between. These bridges are the ones that most people get, and they're made either of ceramics or porcelain that has been fused onto metal.

Cantilever bridges:

Cantilever Bridge Dental are the ones used when there are adjacent teeth on only one side of the gap.

Maryland bonded:



These bridges are also called resin-bonded bridges and are created out of plastic gums and teeth that are supported using a framework made of metal. It consists of wings made of metal on both sides, which get attached to the person's existing teeth.

How Long Will the Dental Bridge Last?

Dental bridges normally serve anywhere from 5-15 years. If the person has regular checkups and practices proper oral hygiene, many times a fixed bridge will last more than 10 years.

People having bridges don't find eating difficult. However, it is a good idea for someone who just got a bridge to stick to soft foods that are cut up small while they are still adjusting.
