

Do I Need a Root Canal?

The root canal treatment is conducted when the nerve or pulp of the tooth becomes affected and enraged due to dental decay, a broken or cracked tooth, or damage to the teeth. Such things will generally cause tooth pain that can leave you in search of ways to get relief. How Do You Know If You Need A Root Canal?

One may require a root canal for a cracked tooth from damages or genetics, a deep cavity, or problems from a prior feeling. Generally, patients require a root canal if they notice their teeth are sensitive, specifically to cold or hot sensations.

Some signs that indicate the need for a root canal stated by the dentists of **Midtown Dental**-

- Cracked or chipped tooth
- Gum darkening or deep decay
- Pimples on gums

- Tender or swollen gums
- Pain while biting or chewing



When Is Root Canal Treatment Required?

The root canal treatment is conducted to eliminate bacteria and dying or dead tissue from inside of the tooth. The pulp forming in the tooth might get infected with the bacteria just because of the damages or a severe, uncured cavity. Without having a treatment, the infection will lead to pain and maybe worse at the time of **tooth extraction**.

What are the Steps of Root Canal Treatment?

A **root canal treatment** involves various steps in its process to extract the infected tooth pulp from a tooth, and seal it to safeguard the tooth from any future pain.

You may expect the following process to relieve the root canal pain-

1. Preparation to determine the infection
2. Numbing up that area
3. Hole in the tooth with the help of drill machine to carry out all the infection from the teeth
4. After removal of infection, the dentist at **emergency dental care** will again seal the tooth or put temporary filling to protect the tooth from pain

5. At last, a dental crown, filling, or other tooth restoration will complete the process of root canal relieving in pain.

In this way, a root canal treatment is carried out!

Does A Root Canal Hurt?

As the anesthesia is being given to every patient which means that the treatment is not that much more painful than a normal dental process, like wisdom **tooth extraction near me** or filling, etc. Although a root canal is usually a bit sore or numb the process may cause discomfort for some days.

How Do I Prevent Root Canal Pain?

Prevention of the root canal process helps in relieving the root canal pain, you need to follow a daily oral care routine of twice brushing a day and daily flossing. Also, visit the **nearest dentist office** regularly to check the situation of root canal treatment and any crowns or fillings.
