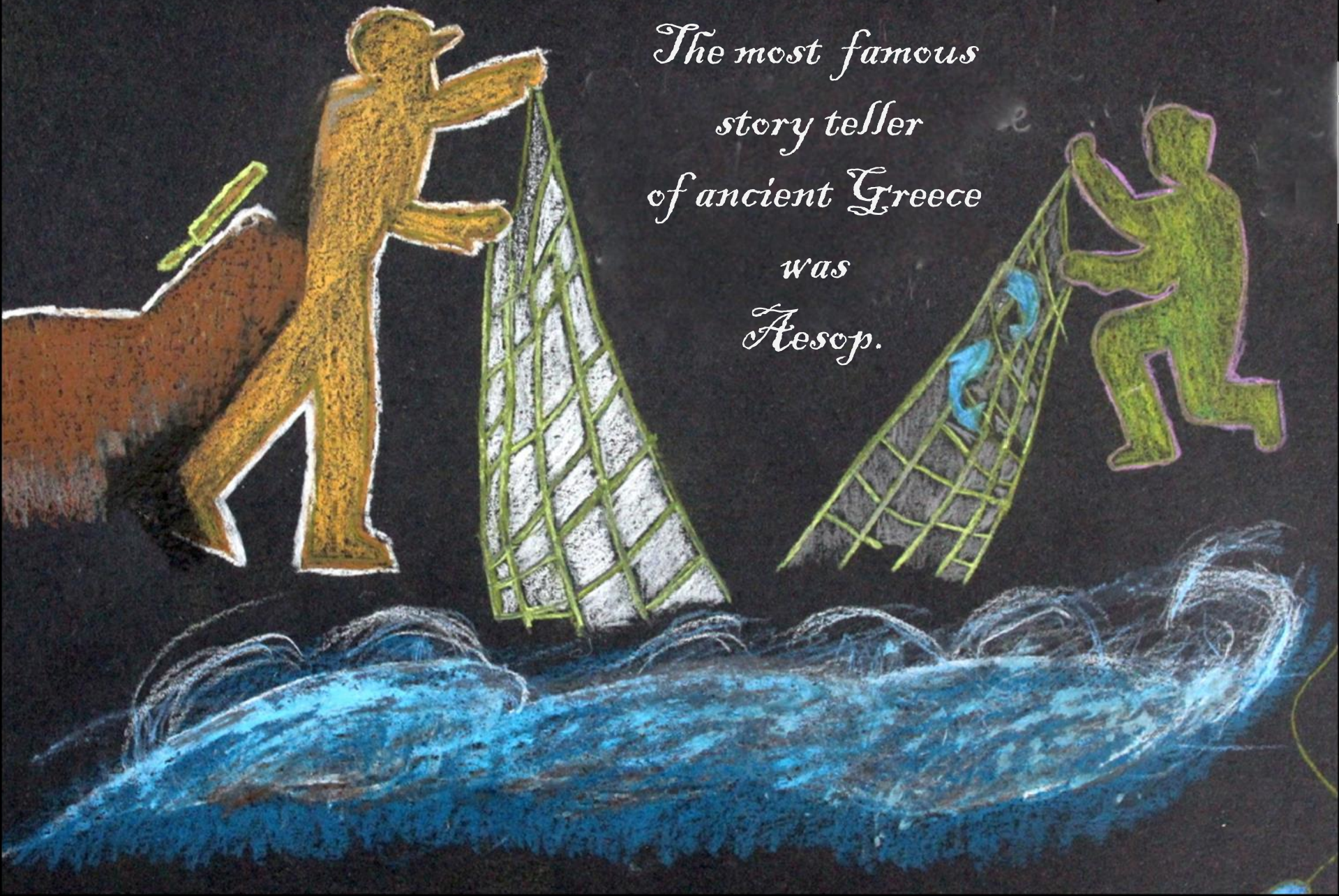
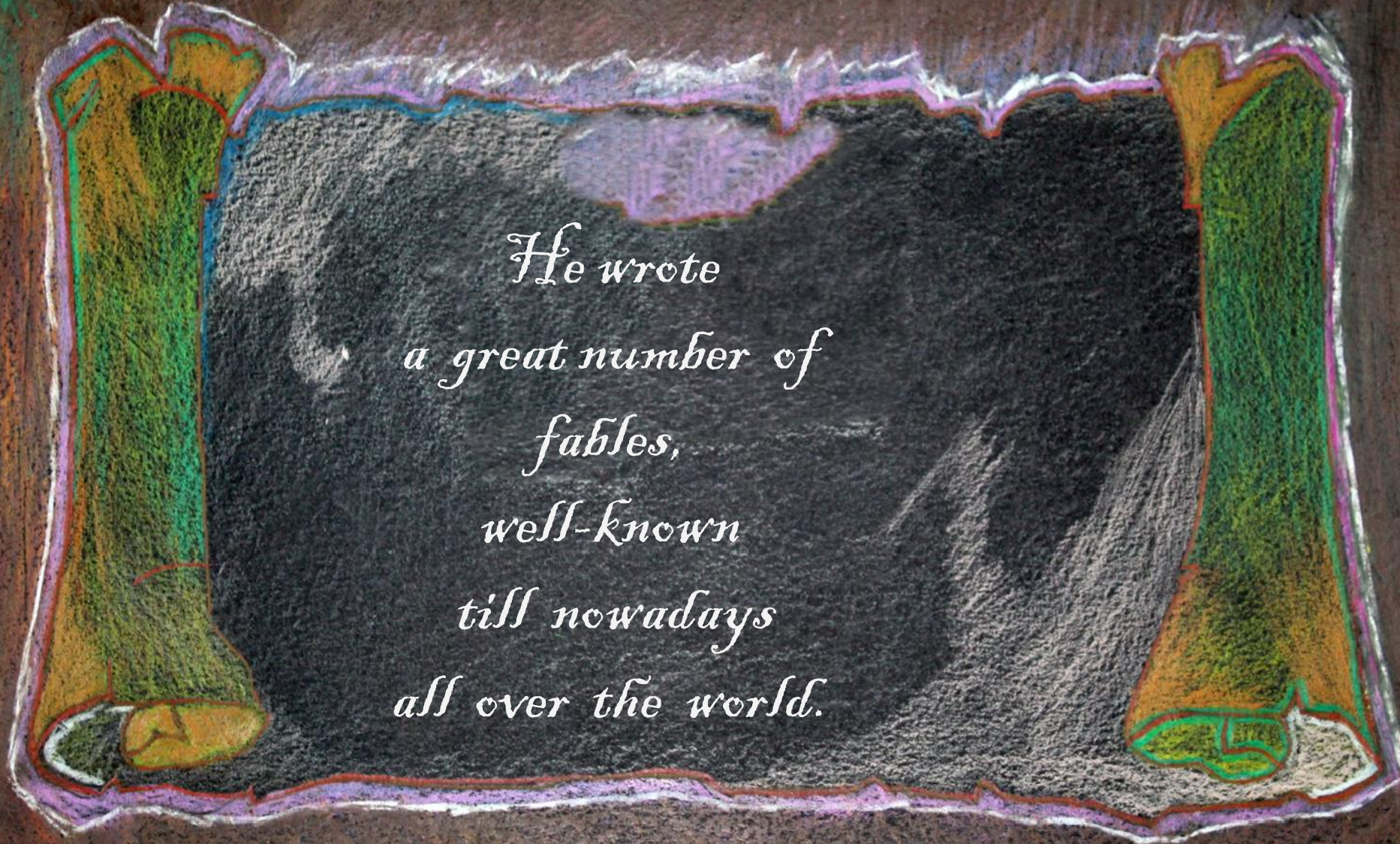

Aesop.*





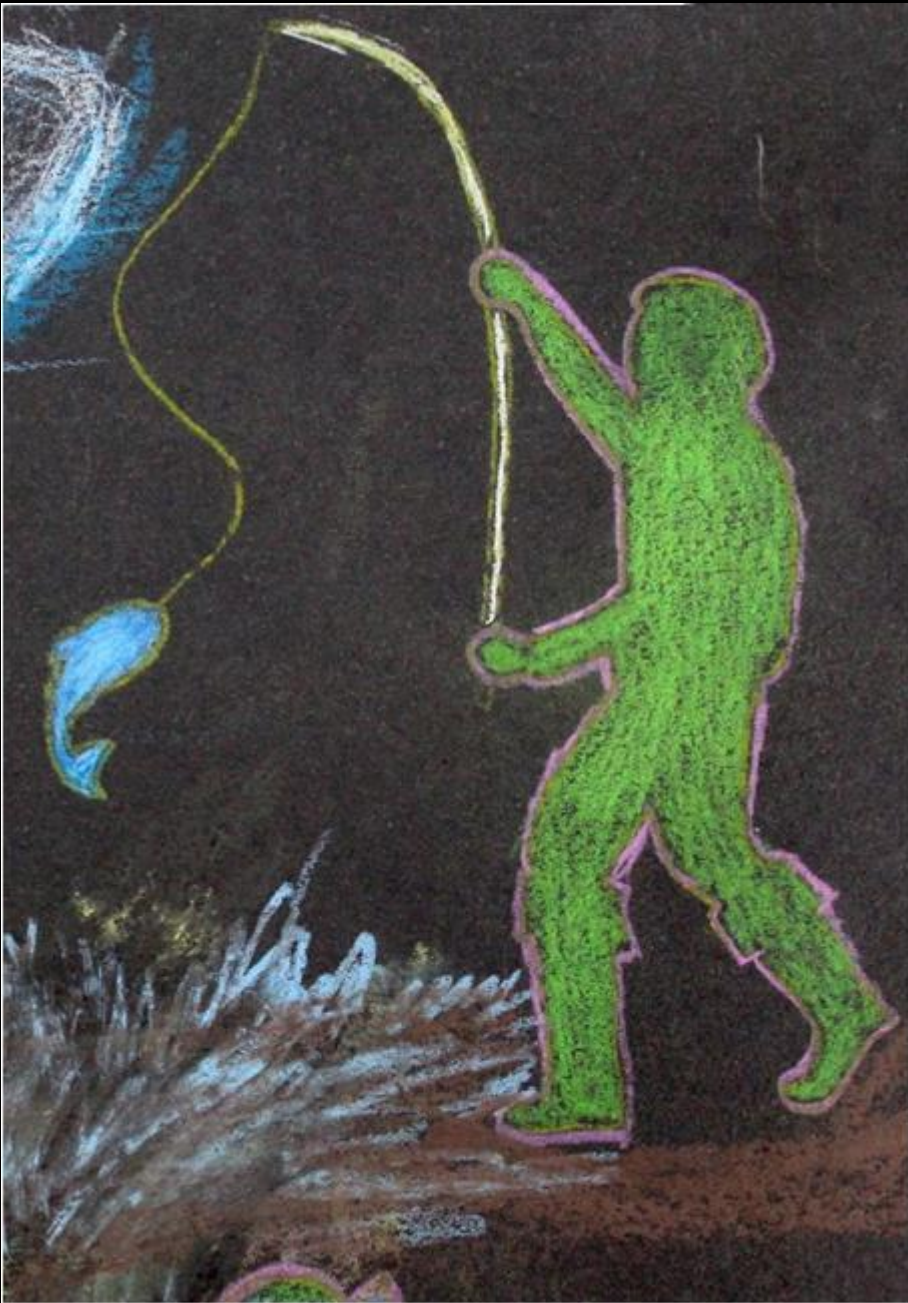
*He wrote

So, let's begin our story....

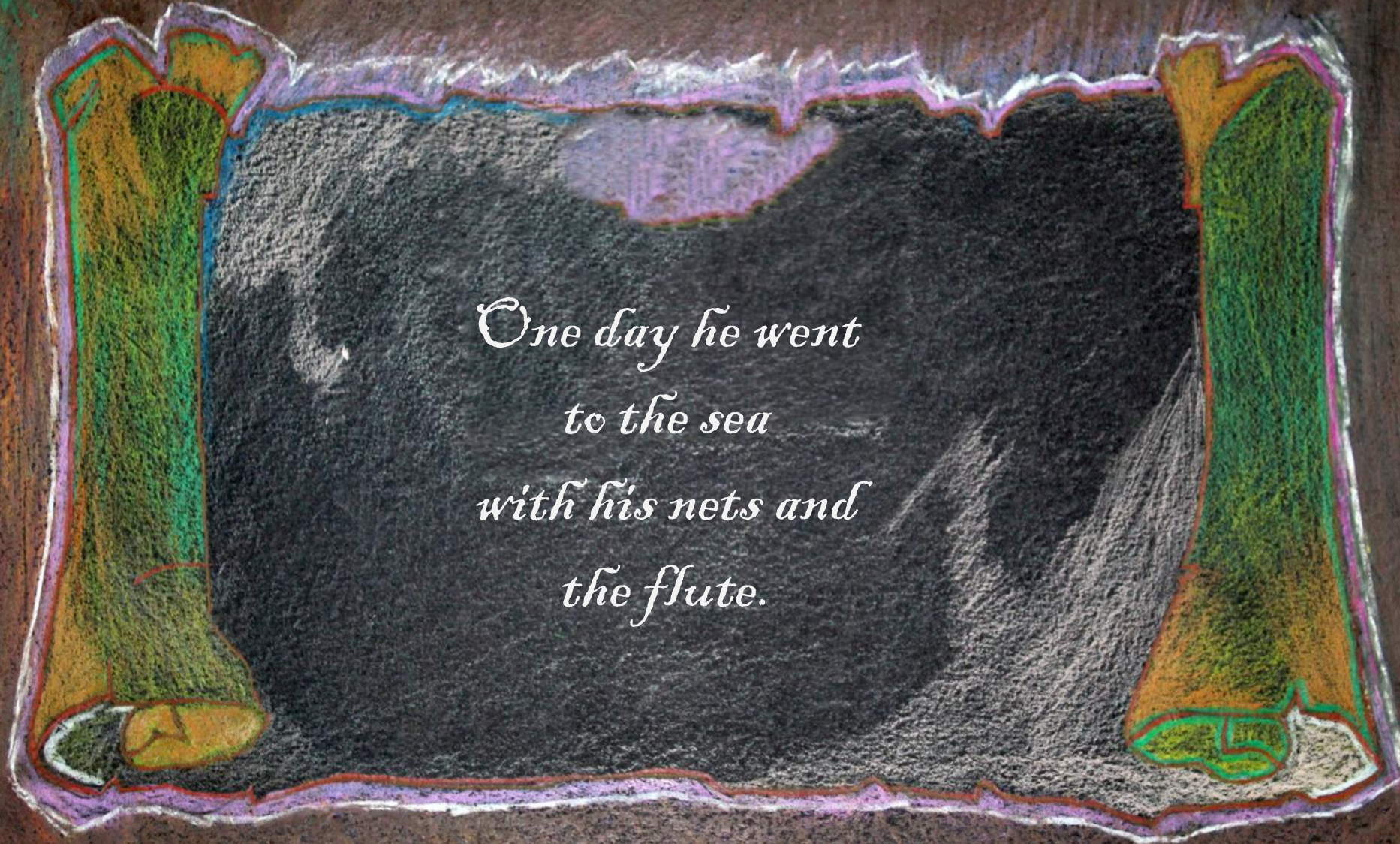
The fisherman

the little fish



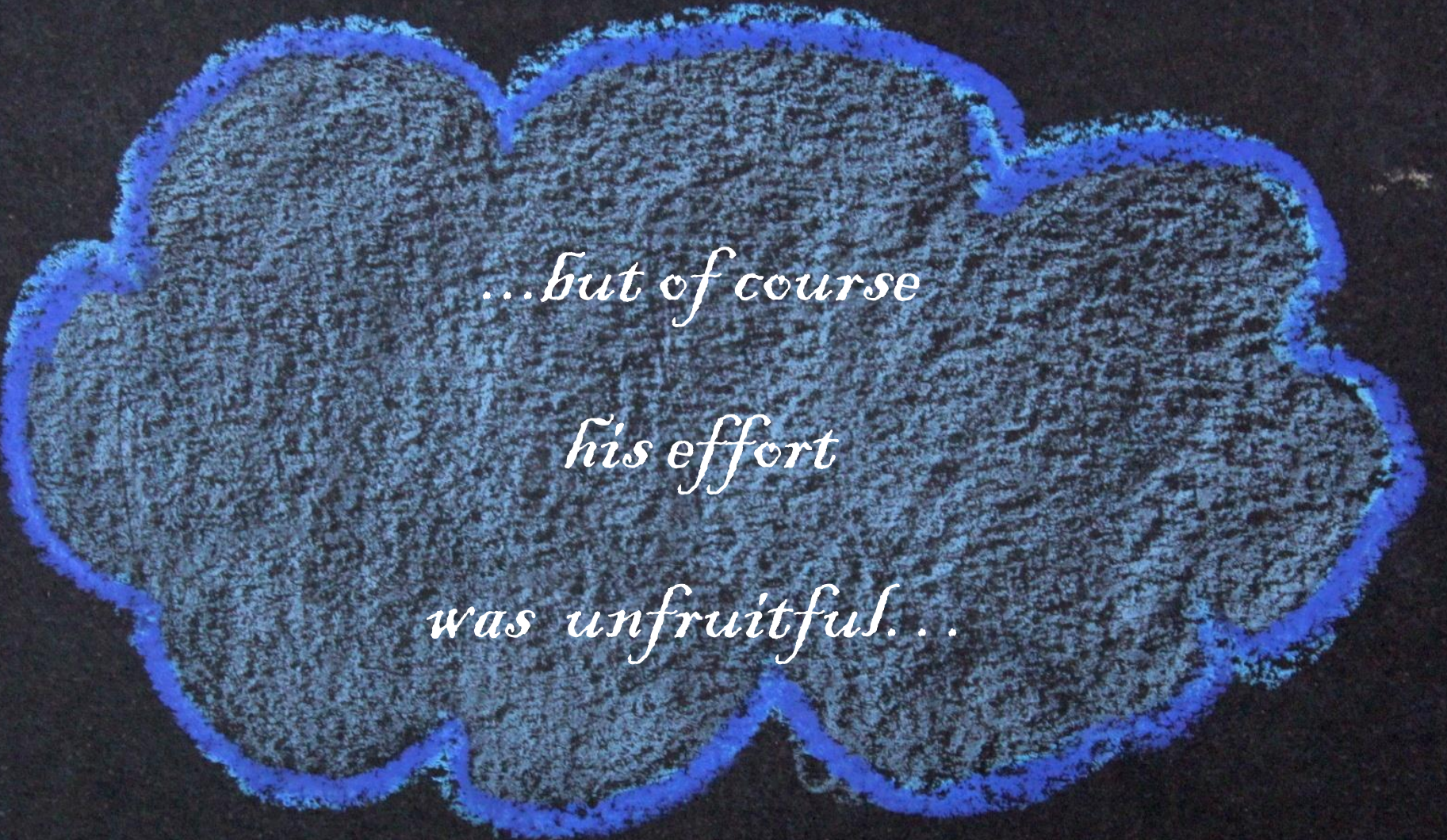
*Once upon a time,

the flute.*

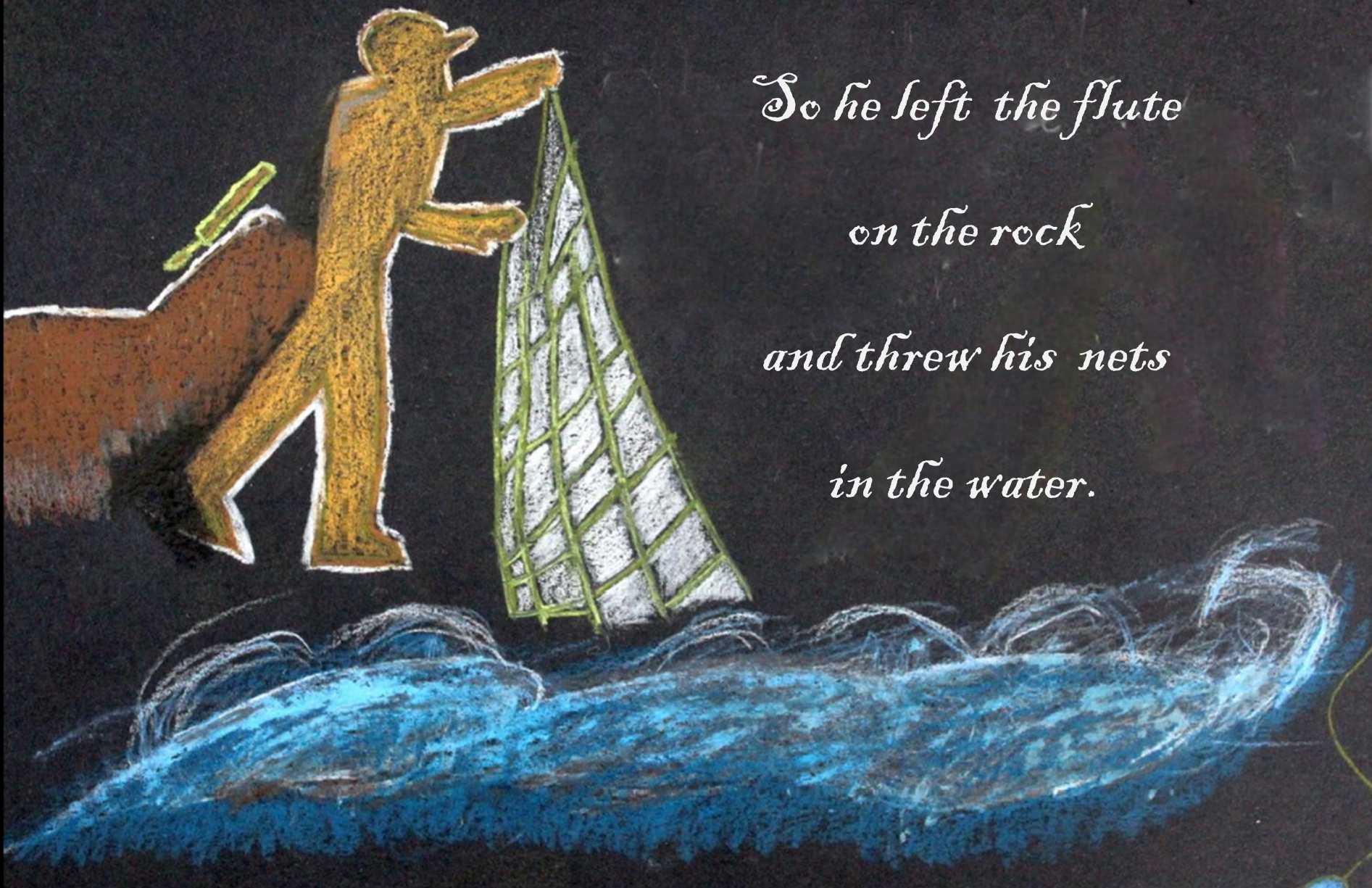


*The fool thought that
