

# PRESENT SIMPLE QUESTIONS WITH WHEN, WHERE, WHAT AND WHO

## Look at the examples:

Where do you come from? Where does he come from?  
When do you read books? When does he read books?  
What do you do after school? What does he do after school?

## Remember how questions with who are formed:

who plays football with you after school?  
Who doesn't speak Japanese?



## Ask questions using when, where or what:

Tom works in London.  
.....  
We have English classes on Mondays.

They do the shopping on Saturdays.

The boys go swimming after school.

We have a pizza for lunch every day.

He studies classical music on Tuesdays.

She goes to England every year.

They buy CDs at the music shop near their house.

David plays the guitar in the afternoon.

## Ask questions using who:

She listens to music every day.

My friends sing very well.

He visits his parents at the weekend.

My parents don't go to the cinema.

Mary doesn't ride a horse.

I don't eat bread for breakfast.

## Ask questions to the underlined parts of the sentences as in the example:

e.g. We play basketball after school.  
*Who plays basketball after school?*  
*When do we play basketball?*

She watches TV in the evenings.

Our best friends live in London.

She works in a primary school.

Cathy likes books.

My mum bakes delicious pies.

You drink tea every morning.

He goes to school after breakfast.

John reads magazines at the weekends.

They go to the Alps in winter.

We go to the cinema every Saturday.
