Am I?

Yes, you are.
Yes, I am.

Yes, you are.
Yes, we are.

Complete the sentences using **am, 'm not, is, isn't, are or aren't**:

e.g. Are you a football player?
Yes, I *am*.

Are they your friends?

Yes, they **are** .

is it an interesting book?

Yes, it **is** .

is your sister in her room?

No, she **isn't** . She is in the kitchen.

are they good at English?

Yes, they **are** .

is he a teacher?

No, **he isn't** . He is a policeman.

is she busy now?

No, she **isn't** .

am I your best friend?

Yes, you **are** .

are you twelve years old?

Yes, we **are** .

are the children hungry?

No, they **aren't** . They are thirsty.

is she from France?

No, she **isn't** . She is from Spain.

are they in the same class?

Yes, they **are** . They are both in the fourth grade.

am I a good student?

Yes, you **are** .

is it sunny today?

No, it **isn't** . It is cloudy and rainy.

are you a pianist?

Yes, I **am** .

Ask questions as in the example:

e.g. It is snowy today (cold?)

Is it cold, too?

Yes, it *is* .

- She is a nice girl. (clever?)

Is she a clever girl?

Yes, **she is** .

- They are good at maths. (history?)

Are they good at history?

No, **they aren't** .

- He is my brother's friend. (your friend?)

Is he your friend?

No, **he isn't** .

- I am a dancer. (singer?)

Are you a singer?

No, I **'m not** .

- She is from England. (London?)

Is she from London?

No, she **isn't** . She is from Manchester.

- You are a nice boy. (helpful?)

Are you a helpful boy?

Yes, you **are** .

- We are thirsty. (hungry?)

Are you thirsty?

No, we **aren't** .

- The shop is open on Saturday. (on Sunday?)

Is the shop open on Sunday?

No, it **isn't** .

- They are at home every evening. (every morning?)

Are they at home every morning?

No, they **aren't** .
