

Le conditionnel – exprimer un souhait

Pour parler de ce que l'on aimerait faire, avoir, être en anglais on utilise la forme :

WOULD LIKE

Construction des phrases :

phrase affirmative :

sujet + would like + to + verbe + complément

on peut contracter would like => 'd like

I would like to be a teacher because I like teaching.

She would like to work as a nurse because she loves helping people.

They 'd like to be engineers because they enjoy creating.

phrase négative :

sujet + would not like + to + verbe + complément

on peut contracter would not like => wouldn't like

I would not like to be a cook because I don't like cooking.

She would not like to work as a policewoman because it is boring.

We wouldn't like to be saleswomen because we hate shopping.

phrase interrogative :

Would + sujet + like + to + verbe + complément + ?

Il n'y a pas de contraction possible.

Would you like to be a vet ?

Would he like to be a pilot ?

Would they like to be surgeons ?

Pour rappel :

- would like est invariable (il ne change pas, ne s'accorde pas)
- le « l » de « would » ne se prononce pas.

WOULD LIKE

est en fait le verbe **aimer** (*en anglais*)
conjugué **au conditionnel** (*modal would en anglais*)

I would like = J'aimerais
