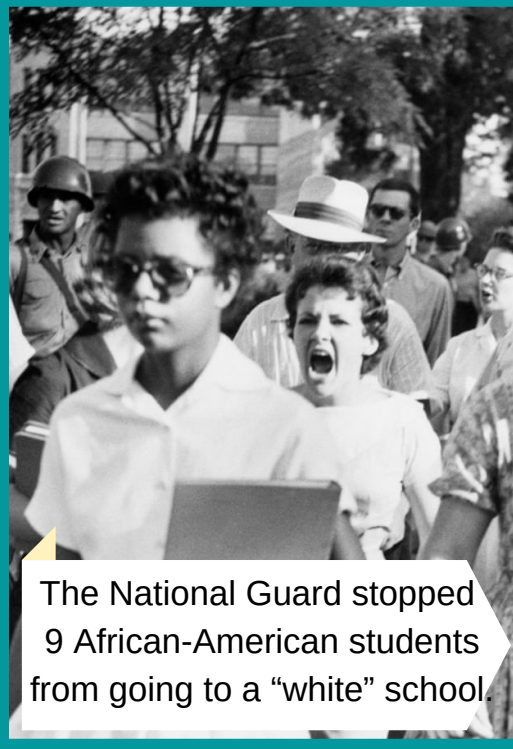
White Spokesmen Warr Of Possible Violence

 Laws requiring racial segregation on buses Montgomery and throughout Alabama were declared unconstitutional yesterday in another historic decision the U.S. Supreme Court.

J.S. Shocked, Saddened by Slaying, Johnson Says

Message Is Given Nation After Assassination

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson spoke Thursday night of an "America shocked and saddened" by the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King as he condemned violence, witness and divisiveness. In a brief message to the nation via television and radio, Johnson disclosed that he is postponing a trip to Hawaii for a Vietnam strategy conference. He had been scheduled to leave around midnight. He said he will leave sometime Friday. The President appeared in the doorway of the White House offices, stern-faced and spoke on television and radio networks.

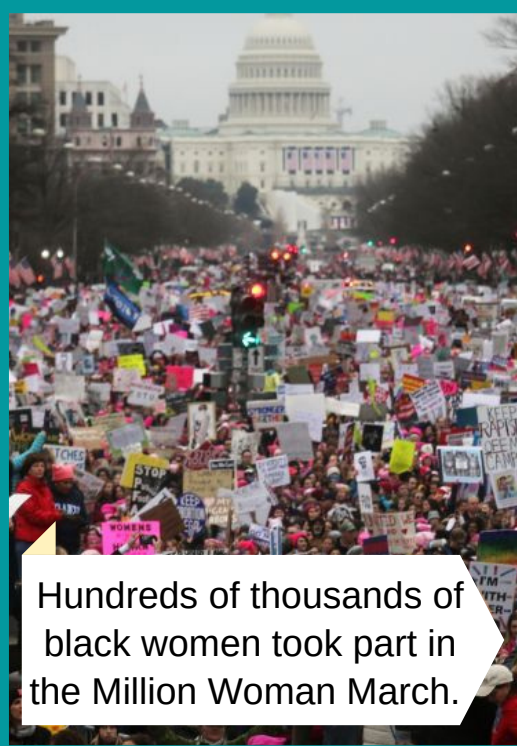

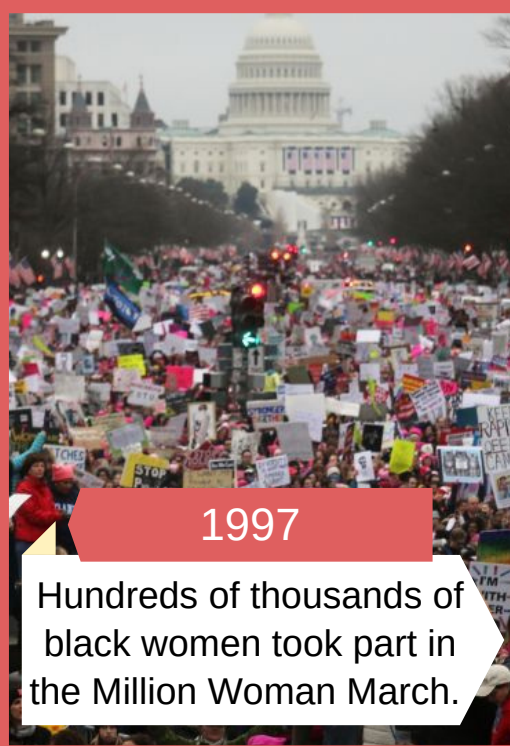

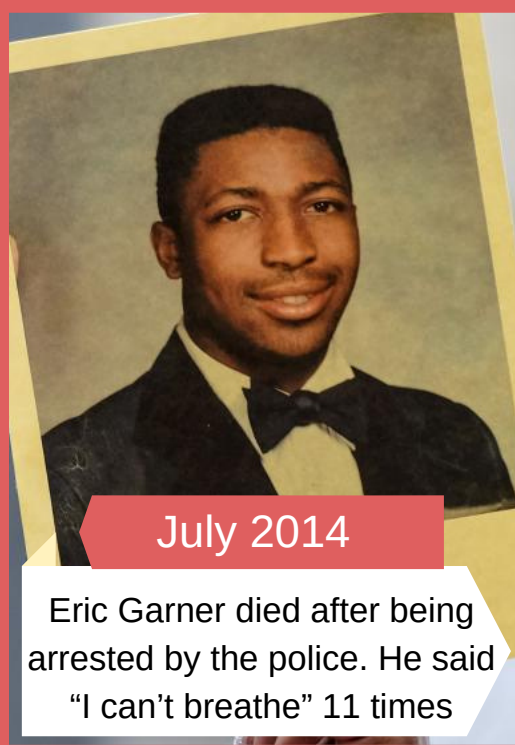
