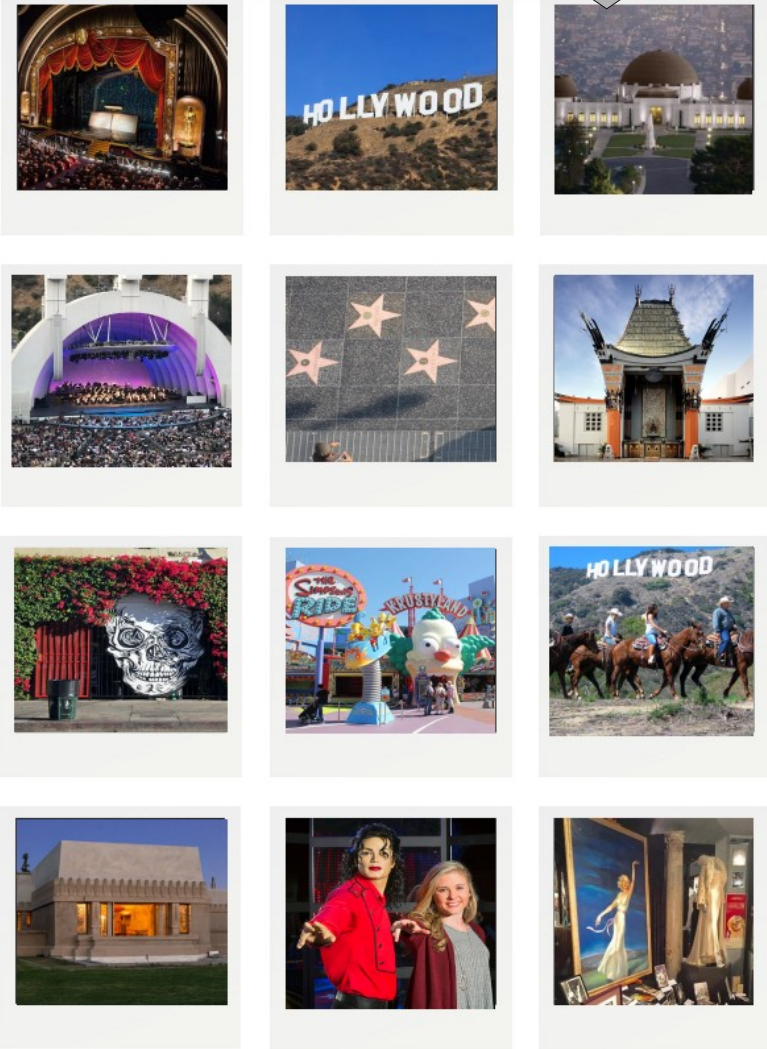

- 1 • The Walk of Fame**
A truly iconic piece of American cultural history on Hollywood Boulevard. Today, there are over 2,600 stars and the site attracts about ten million visitors each year.
- 2 • The Hollywood sign.**
Built in the 1920s, the huge white letters are almost 45 feet tall.
- 3 • The Universal Studios.**
It is both a filming studio and a theme park.
- 4 • Griffith Observatory.**
A popular Los Angeles attraction that offers a spectacular view.
- 5 • Hollywood Wax Museum.**
Visitors can pose and take photos with the wax figures of their favourite celebrities and characters such as James Bond and Marilyn Monroe .
- 6 • The Dolby Theater.**
It is the home of the Oscars, the biggest red carpet night in Hollywood.
- 7 • The Hollywood Bowl.**
It is an amphitheater where people can attend concerts.

This place contains artwork done by serial killers, collections of coffins and historical execution devices.

- 10 • Hollywood Museum.**
It contains amazing exhibits of costumes and props of some classic films.
- 11 • Sunset Ranch Hollywood.**
Visitors can see Los Angeles from the back of a horse.
