- But at the start of the 1960's the USA was losing the race.



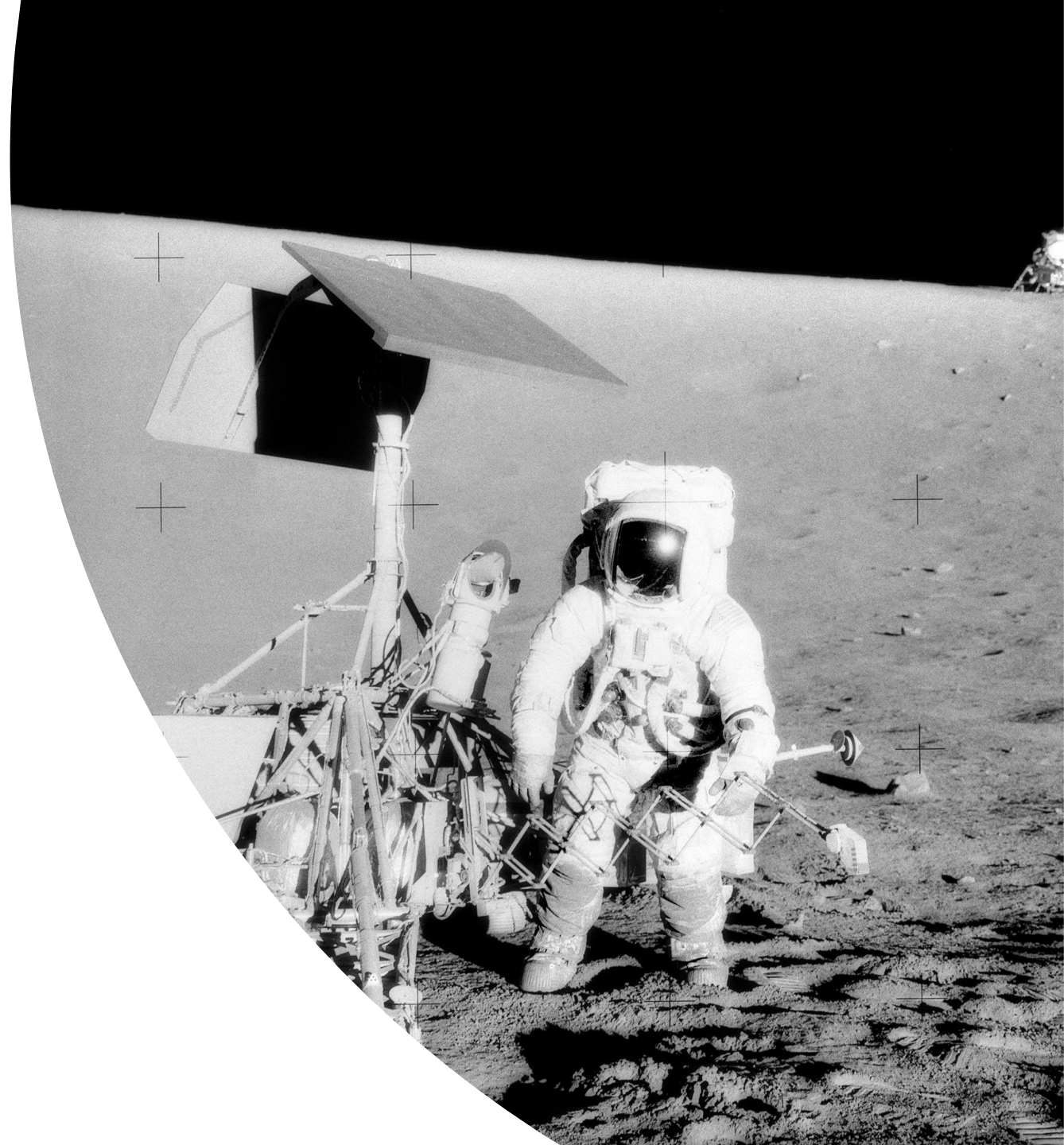
Evidence 2:

- Before going to the moon, the astronauts trained in a fake moon environment.

Evidence 3:

- Surveyor 3 was an unmanned probe sent by America to the Moon in 1967 to explore the Moon's surface.
- Parts of it were brought back to Earth by astronauts in 1969.



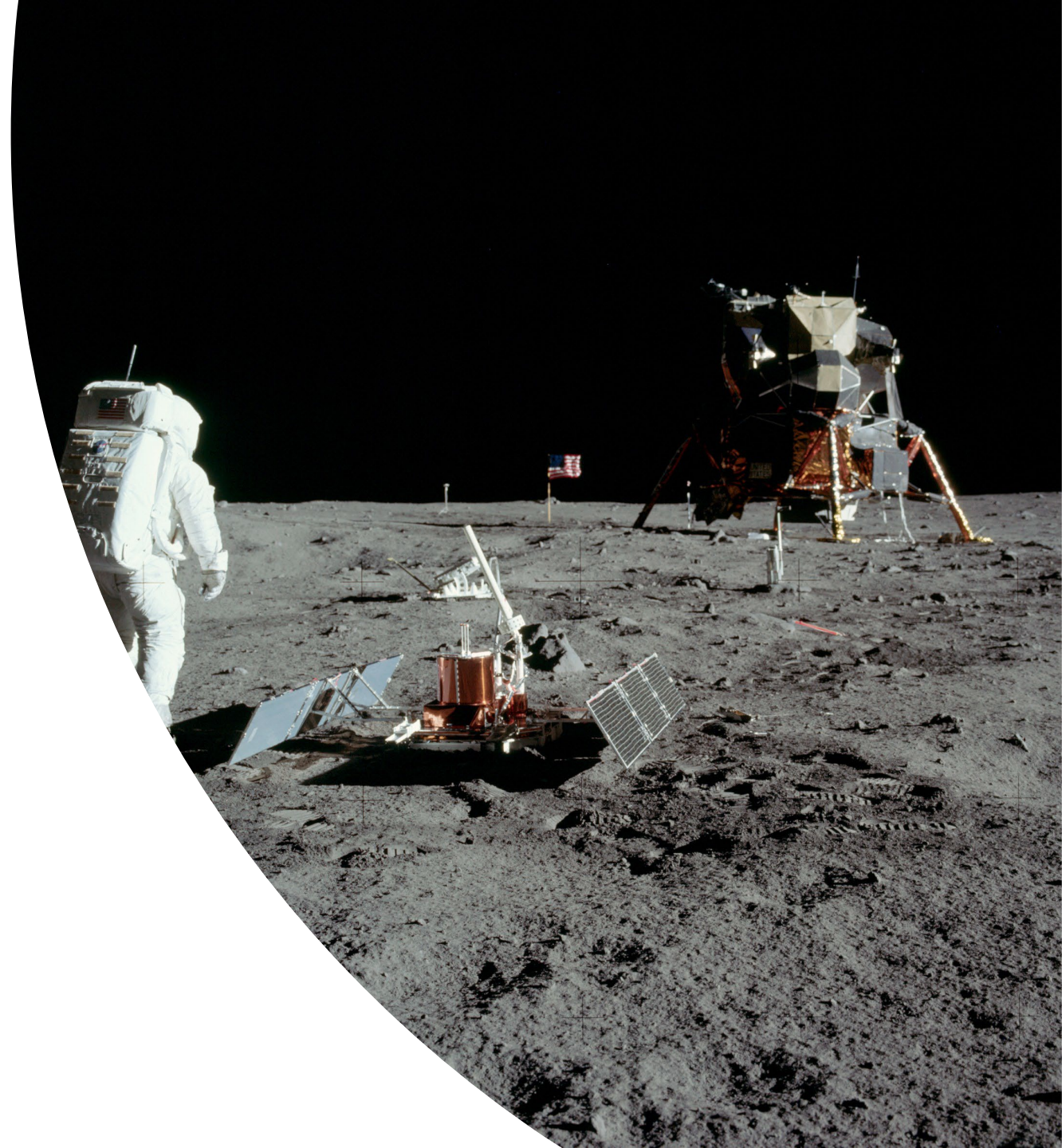
Evidence 4:

- Bill Kaysing worked at the company where the engines for the Moon rocket were being made.
- He claimed that the rockets did not work properly.
- But he was not an engineer or a scientist.



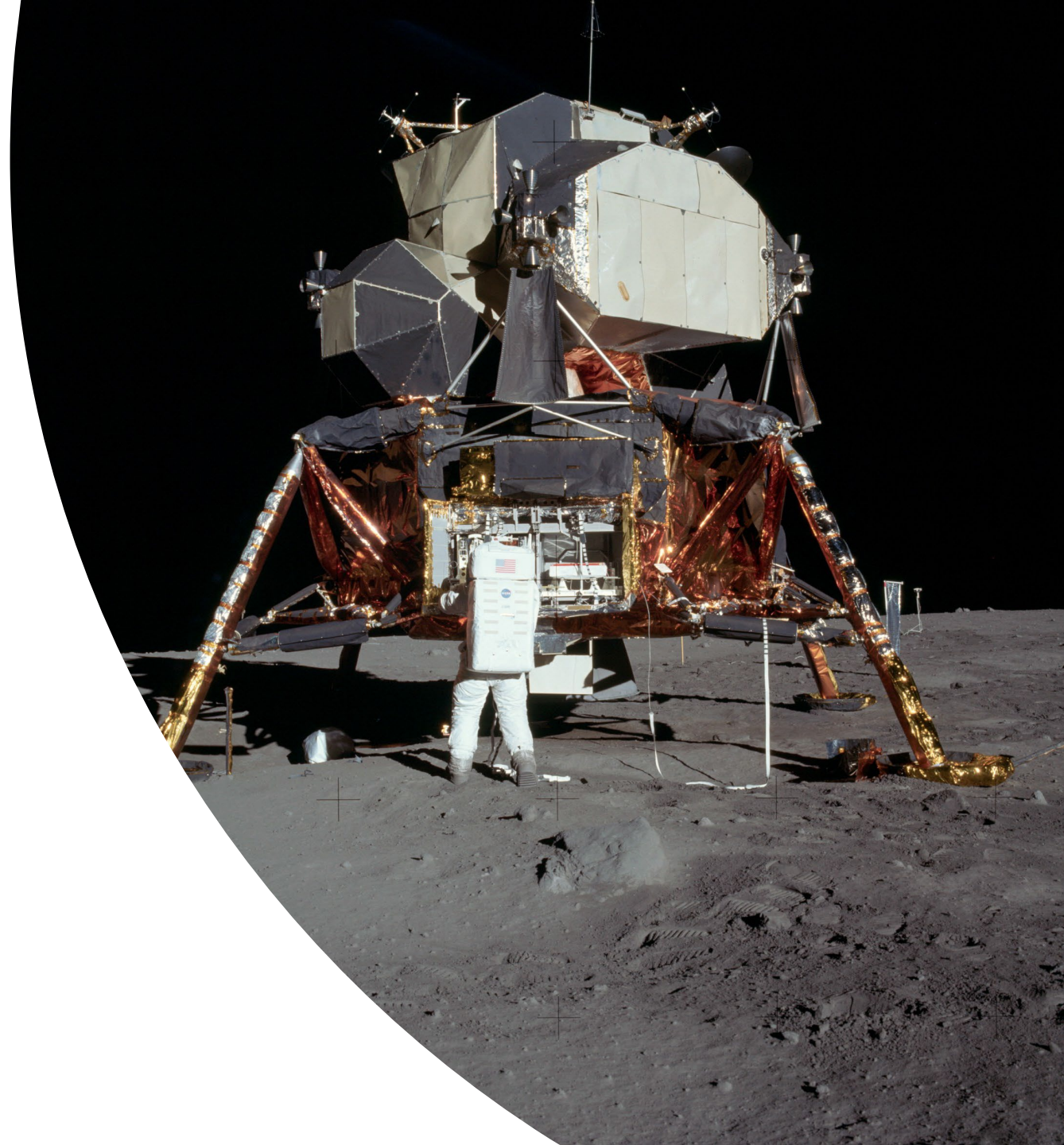
Evidence 5:

- In the pictures taken of astronauts on the surface of the Moon, there are no stars visible.



Evidence 6:

- The Moon lander had a large rocket on the bottom to slow down it's landing and allow it to touch down safely.
- Why didn't the force of this rocket blasting against the Moon's surface cause a large crater underneath the lander?



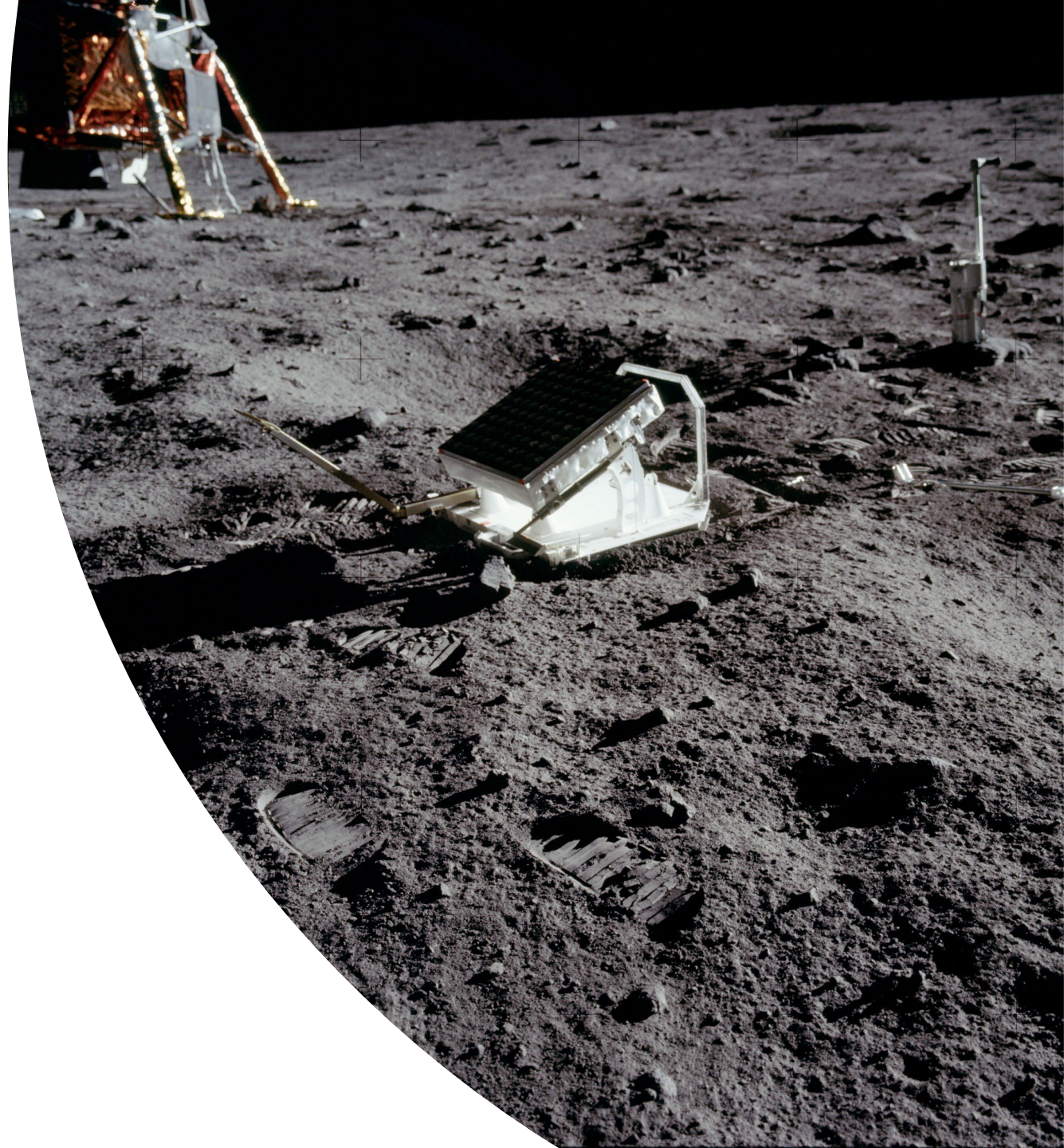
Evidence 7:

- The rockets that America sent the astronauts to the Moon in were tracked by several countries using radar.



Evidence 8:

- The American astronauts left mirrors on the Moon's surface.
- Scientist on Earth have fired lasers at the mirrors and had the lasers reflected back at them.



Evidence 9:

- John. F. Kennedy (JFK) was the American President in 1961. In a famous speech, he promised that the USA would get a man on the Moon by the end of the 1960's.
- Some people think that it was impossible to get a man on the Moon at that time and so it was faked to prevent embarrassment



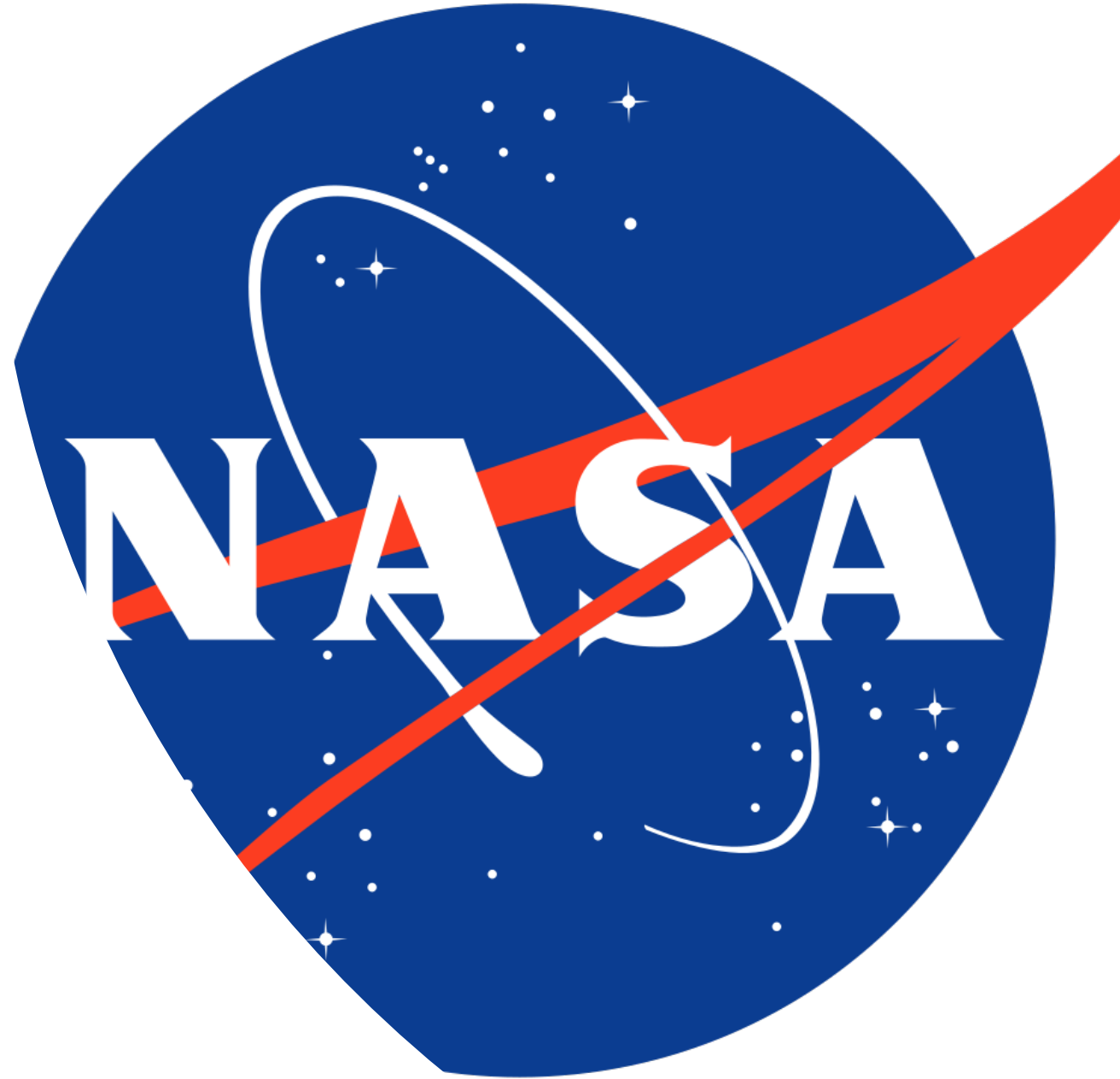
Evidence 10:

- On one of the photos of the Moon's surface, one of the rocks has what looks like a 'C' written on it.
- Could this be because it is a film prop and the Moon landings were really filmed in a studio?



Evidence 11:

- 400,000 people worked at NASA for nearly 10 years to develop the technology for the first manned mission to the Moon.
- If the Moon landings were faked, a lot of people would have to be able to keep a very big secret.



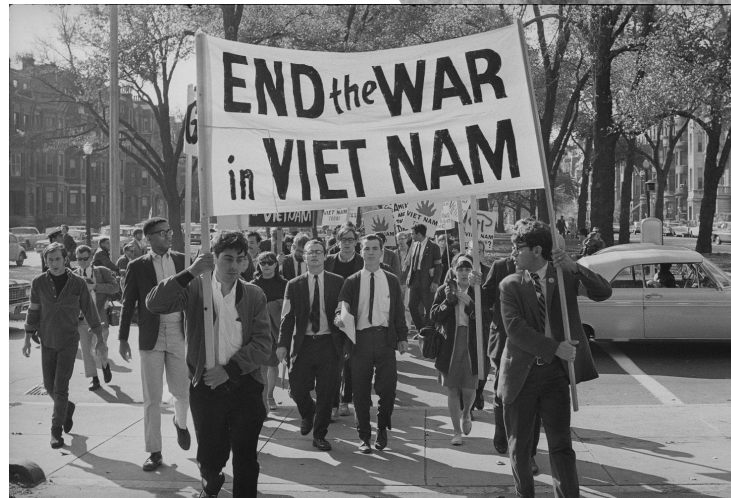
Evidence 12:

- Neil Armstrong was the first person to step onto the Moon's surface.
- He was filmed getting out of the Moon lander.
- But who filmed him?



Evidence 13:

- In the 1960's the USA was at war in Vietnam.
- It was very unpopular with many Americans.
- Some people think the Moon landings were faked as a way of distracting the American people from the war.
- The last American Moon landing was around the time the war ended



Evidence 14:

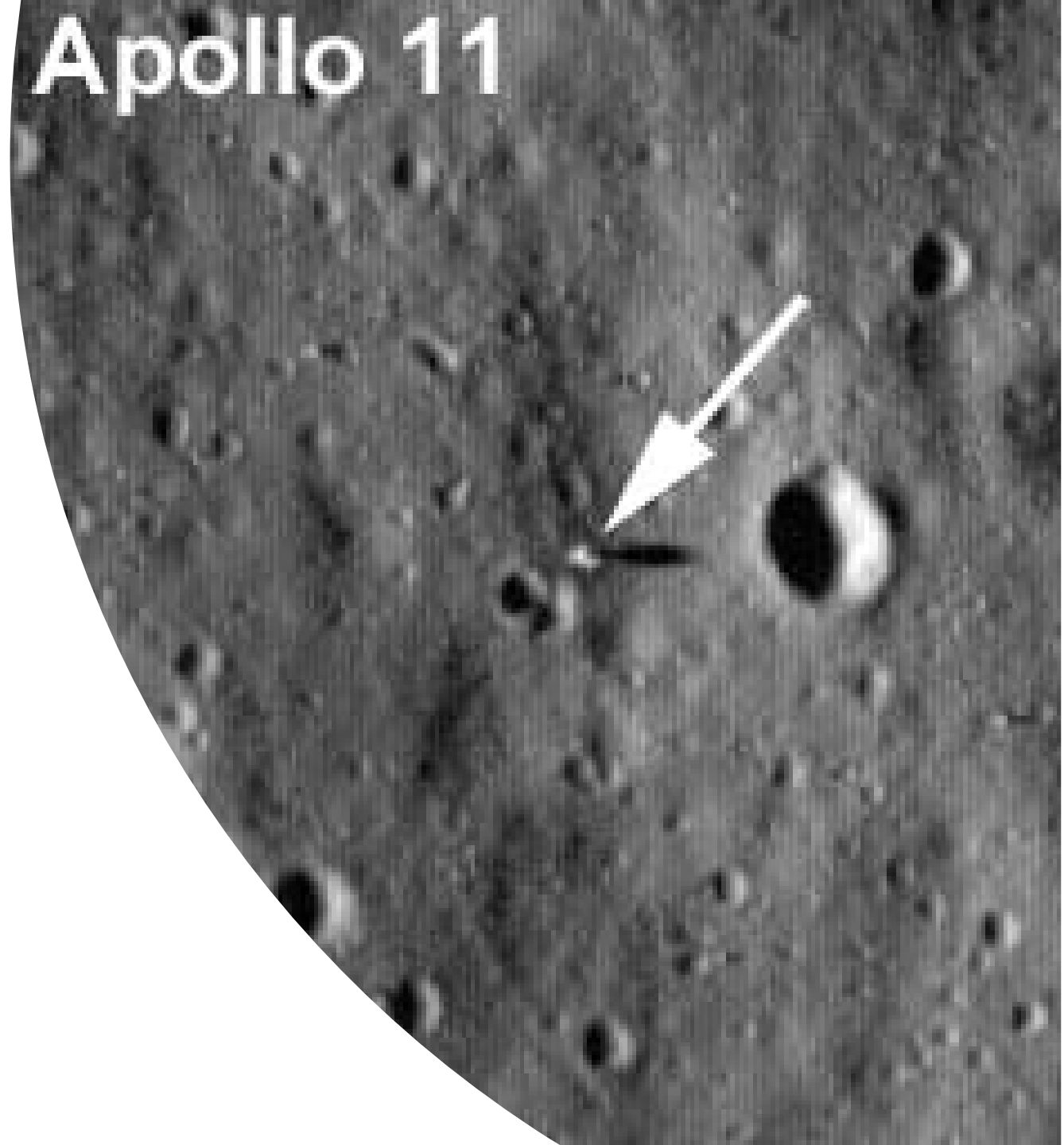
- The astronauts supposedly bought samples of Moon rocks back with them.
- Experts from around the world agree that these rocks must have come from the Moon.
- But could these rocks have landed on Earth before as meteorites?

- In 2007 Japan sent a satellite to the Moon to take pictures of the surface.
- They photographed the area where one of the American missions had landed.
- They saw marks on the surface where the lunar module had been.



Evidence 16:

- On the way to the Moon, the astronauts would have to travel through areas of space which have very high levels of cosmic radiation.
- Some people think that the radiation is too high for them to have survived.



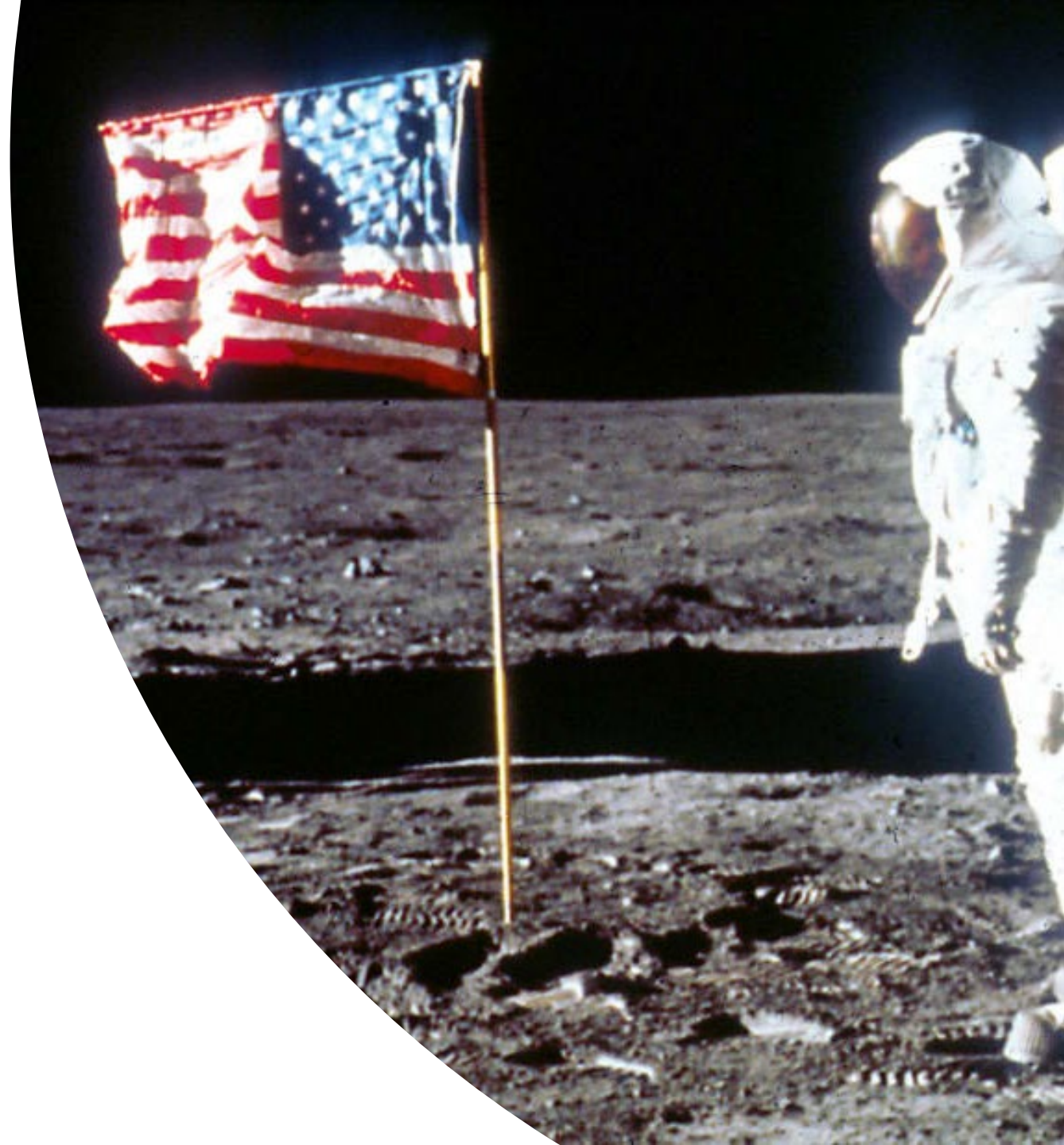
Evidence 17:

- The astronauts took lots of pictures whilst on the Moon's surface with cameras that use photographic film.
- The temperature on the Moon's surface get's very hot.
- Hot enough that the film should have melted.



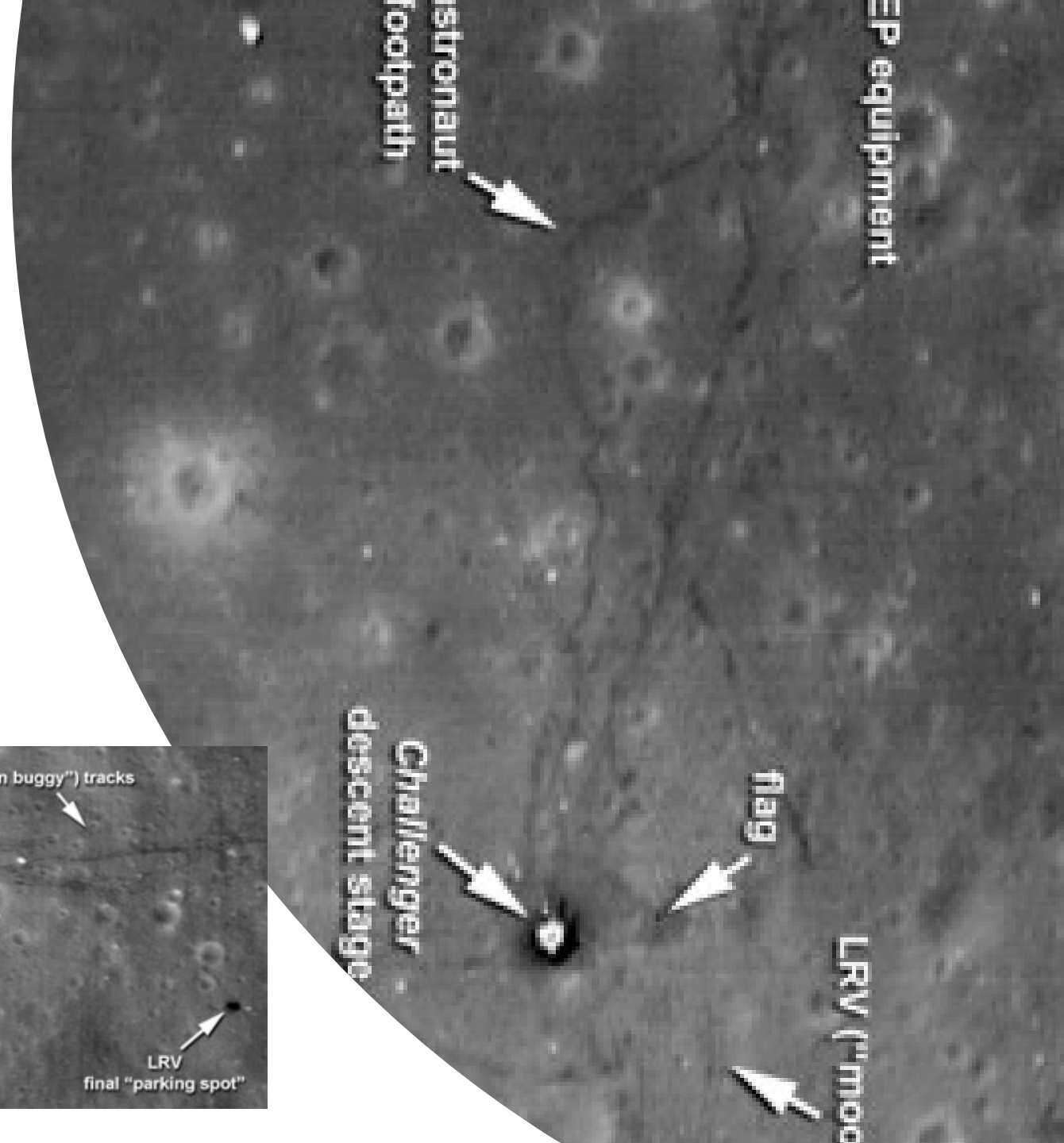
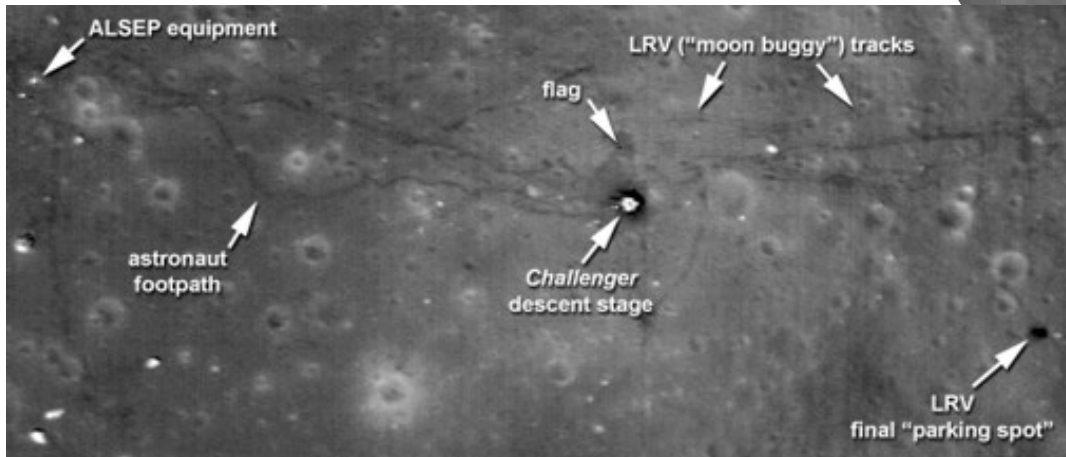
Evidence 18:

- In 2009 an American satellite took pictures of one of the areas that was visited by the manned space missions.
- You can see the tracks left by the lunar buggy (The vehicle the astronauts used to travel around) the surface.

- Some of the pictures taken on the Moon's surface were supposedly taken miles apart.
- But the backgrounds look the same.
- Could this be because they are a painted backdrop on a film set?



Evidence 21:

- In the 1960's The USA and the Soviet Union were in competition to be the first to get Man to the Moon.
- If the Soviet Union could prove the Moon landings were fake, it would be very embarrassing for the USA.
- But, the Soviet Union had equipment that was able to track the American spacecraft to the Moon.
