Like



À la forme affirmative

- Like + nom / V-ing
- Likes + nom / V-ing (3^e pers. du singulier)

I like sports. My sister likes listening to music.

À la forme négative

- Don't like + nom / V-ing
- Doesn't like + nom / V-ing (3^e pers. du singulier)

I don't like tennis. My sister doesn't like video games.

À la forme interrogative

- Do + Sujet + like + nom / V-ing
- Does + sujet 3^e personne + like + nom / V-ing

*Do you like curry?
Does your Dad like cooking?*



Au présent simple, j'ajoute un « S » au à la fin du verbe à la 3eme personne du singulier : HE / SHE / IT.
L'auxiliaire « DO » se transforme en « DOES » dans les questions.
L'auxiliaire « DONT » se transforme en « DOESN'T » dans les phrases négatives.
