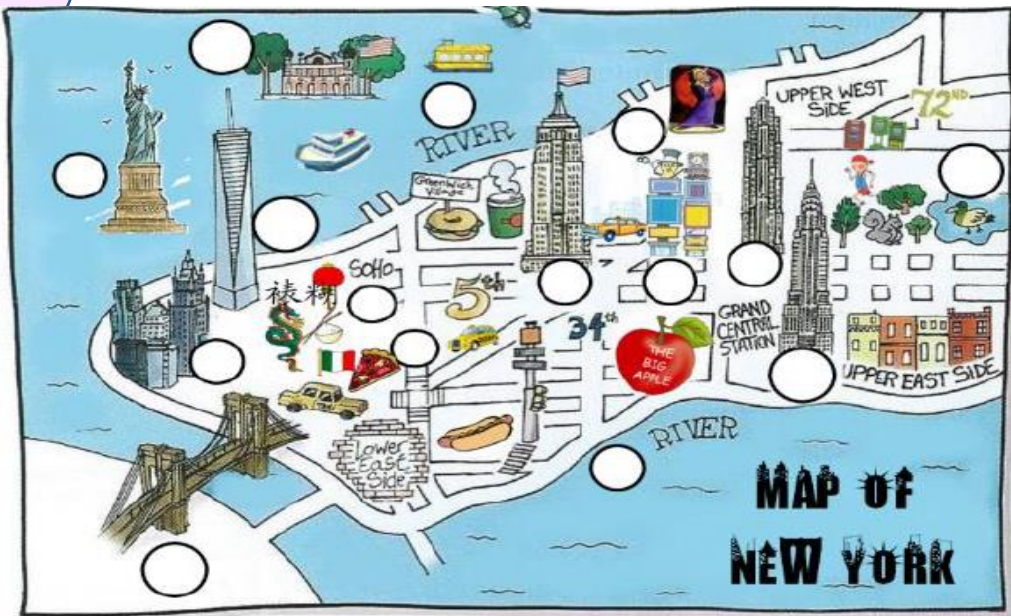


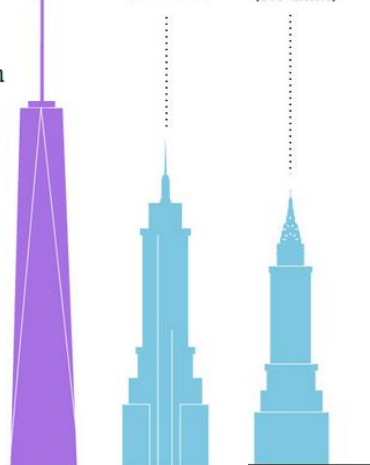

Yankee stadium is the ballpark of the New York Yankees Baseball team. The Yankees are one of *the best* and *most famous* baseball teams in America.



The Empire State building is a 102-story skyscraper (very tall building) and was *the world's tallest* building until (jusqu'à) 1972. Today, many tourists go to the observation deck (plateforme) at the top of the tower to enjoy the amazing view of the city.
