LEAD PARAGRAPH: Describe, outline what the article is about (in brief).

SUB-HEADING: A kind of headline but a little longer with more details.

NAMEPLATE: The name of the newspaper company. A stylized font is usually used.

ILLUSTRATION: Visual element to attract attention.
