The topic of the program is Save the planet.

Paul Brown **has worked** as an **environment** correspondent for the Guardian **since 1990**.

He **has worked** with the Greenpeace organization too.

He **has been** interested in the environment **for over 50 years**.

He **has lived** in Africa and he **has travelled** all over the world.

“Global Warning : the last chance” is the title of Paul Brown’s book.

He **wrote** about the important issues on environment :

- 1) **Deforestation** : we **are burning** more and more forest.
We **have destroyed** over 80% of the world’s forests.
- 2) **Pollution** from cars, factories and planes : it creates **climate change** and **global warming**.
- 3) **Global warming** : Desertification because there are more and more deserts everywhere. The multiplication of **hurricanes** and **tornadoes**.
The polar ice cap is melting dramatically in the North Pole.
Since 1979, the size of the Summer polar ice cap **has shrunk** by more than 20%.
London and New-York could disappear because of **the rise of sea levels**.
