

Les boutons en bas du cadre te permettent de naviguer d'une question à une autre (*previous* et *next*) et, si tu le souhaites, de vérifier la validité de ta réponse (*submit*).

En dernière page tu trouveras ton score.

RECOMMANDATIONS POUR LA COMPREHENSION DE L'ORAL (1/2)

Voici les indices qui peuvent te permettre, associés à tes déductions et à ton bon sens, de comprendre l'essentiel des enregistrements audio qui te sont proposés. Pas de panique, il n'est pas nécessaire de tout comprendre pour déterminer la réponse correcte !

- La lecture de la question, s'il y en a une, et des propositions de réponse, lorsqu'elles sont sous forme écrite, te permet tout d'abord d'imaginer ce que tu vas entendre dans l'enregistrement.
- Il ne te faut pas essayer de tout comprendre dans l'enregistrement ; tu dois prendre appui sur ce qui te permet de comprendre le sens de l'enregistrement :
 - o les **mots répétés** indiquent très souvent le **thème** de ce que l'on entend ;
 - o les **mots accentués** (la syllabe accentuée, s'il y en a plusieurs, est prononcée **plus fort** et plus distinctement) portent l'**essentiel du message** : plus tu en identifies, plus le propos va te sembler clair, car cela te permettra de dissocier les divers éléments des phrases, et tu pourras en déduire ce qui est dit ;
 - o le **dernier mot d'une phrase**, très souvent accentué d'ailleurs, apporte des informations précieuses sur ce que l'on entend. On pose généralement d'abord un sujet avant d'apporter ensuite une **information nouvelle** le concernant ;
 - o les remarques précédentes signifient que lorsque tu apprends de nouveaux mots, en plus de leur sens et de leur orthographe, tu dois savoir les **prononcer correctement et les reconnaître à l'oral**. Certains mots qui ressemblent beaucoup au français dans leur orthographe sont parfois difficiles à entendre par des francophones car leur prononciation est très différente en anglais !
- Pour segmenter ce que tu entends et savoir **où démarrent et s'arrêtent les phrases**, tu pourras t'appuyer sur :
 - o les pauses ;
 - o le changement de personne qui parle ;
 - o les **intonations descendantes** qui marquent une fin, une conclusion.

RECOMMANDATIONS POUR LA COMPREHENSION DE L'ORAL (2/2)

- Il y a aussi parfois dans les enregistrements que tu vas écouter des **énumérations**, c'est-à-dire que la personne dresse une **liste** de choses qui relèvent d'une **même catégorie**. Tu peux les repérer grâce aux indices suivants :
 - o une **intonation montante** à la fin de chaque élément de cette énumération ;
 - o des **pauses fréquentes** qui séparent chaque élément.
- Il pourra t'être très utile de savoir repérer les **questions** que tu entendras. Il en existe **deux types** :
 - o les **questions fermées** (auxquelles on ne peut que **répondre par « oui » ou « non »**, ou quelque chose d'équivalent) sont reconnaissables à l'**intonation montante** en fin de phrase ;
 - o les **questions ouvertes** (auxquelles on répond en **donnant une information**) sont caractérisées par un **premier mot en WH-** (*who, where, when, what, why, whose, how*) qui est **accentué**, et une **intonation descendante** en fin de phrase.
- Enfin, certaines **habitudes et coutumes**, qui ne sont **pas limitées à l'oral seulement** mais auxquelles tout le monde se conforme pour communiquer et être compris, te permettront d'éclaircir le sens de ce que tu entends.
 - o On a l'habitude de **présenter le sujet** de ce dont on parle dans une **première phrase**. Il te sera ainsi très utile, dans chaque enregistrement, de bien te concentrer sur celle-ci. Des informations plus détaillées sont données ensuite.
 - o Dans le cas d'un **dialogue**, certains **pronoms** désignent les **personnes qui parlent** (*I / you / we*), alors que certains autres désignent **ce dont on parle** (*he / she / it / they*). Si tu les repères, tu pourras ainsi déterminer si ce que tu entends se rapporte aux **interlocuteurs** ou bien au **sujet** dont il est question dans leur conversation. Attention, dans un dialogue, quand la **personne qui parle change**, les **pronoms tournent** : *I* devient *you* et inversement, comme en français !

Tu peux comprendre une information très simple, donnée dans une situation connue.

A2 correspond à un niveau intermédiaire, celui que tu dois avoir atteint, au minimum, en fin de troisième.

Tu peux comprendre des expressions et un vocabulaire fréquemment utilisés dans des annonces, discussions ou reportages simples en lien avec ce qui te concerne de très près, par exemple : toi, ta famille et ton environnement immédiat, l'école, les loisirs, etc. Tu peux saisir l'essentiel d'annonces et de messages simples et clairs.

B1 correspond à un niveau d'utilisateur indépendant. C'est le niveau que tu vises en troisième.

Tu peux comprendre les points essentiels de messages de longueur variable et de différente nature (reportages, interviews, films, etc.) quand un langage clair et standard est utilisé et s'il s'agit de sujets familiers concernant l'école, les loisirs, le travail, les projets individuels ou collectifs, les relations sociales, etc.
