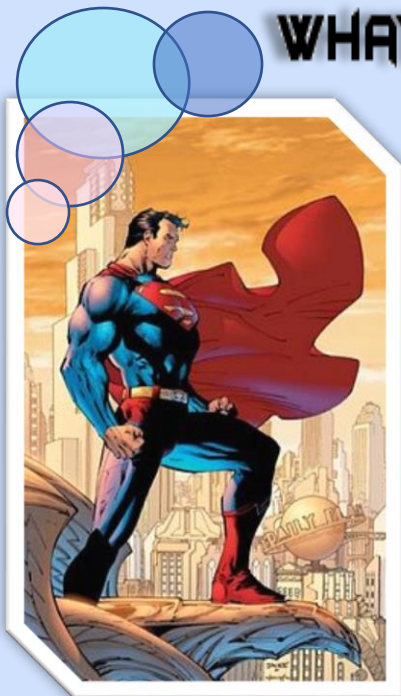


WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE A SUPERHERO ?



Superman possesses extraordinary powers. He is **faster than** a speeding bullet, **more powerful than** a locomotive, and able to leap tall buildings in a single bound. For most of his existence, Superman's famous arsenal of powers has included flight, super-strength, invulnerability to non-magical attacks, super-speed, vision powers (including x-ray, heat-emitting, telescopic, infra-red, and microscopic vision), super-hearing, and super-breath. Superman is not human; he comes from a planet called Krypton but doesn't live there anymore because of its implosion. He lives and works in Metropolis as a journalist for the Daily Planet under the identity of Clark Kent. Secretly in love with his colleague Lois Lane, he doesn't know how to tell how he feels about her. He often visits his foster parents in Smallville and helps his dad in the farm. They don't want him to reveal his real identity.



What do we know about Batman ? First, he doesn't have inherent superhuman powers and doesn't come from an alien planet. Where does he live ? In Gotham City. His real identity is Bruce Wayne. Bruce is a charming billionaire who doesn't need to work every day. He's very brilliant and can invent and use a variety of weapons and tools for fighting crime. He can't fly or see through walls, but he's got excellent acrobatic skills and is very strong and intelligent. He drives the Bat-mobile, a very fast and sophisticated car. His friends are Alfred, his old butler, who always cooks for him, and young Robin, an ex circus performer who helps him in his missions. In the stories Batman is regarded as one of **the world's greatest** detectives; if not the world's greatest crime solver. He is not **as powerful as** Superman but he is probably one of **the most intelligent** superheroes. Batman uses a large arsenal of specialized gadgets in his war against crime, the designs of which usually share a bat motif.

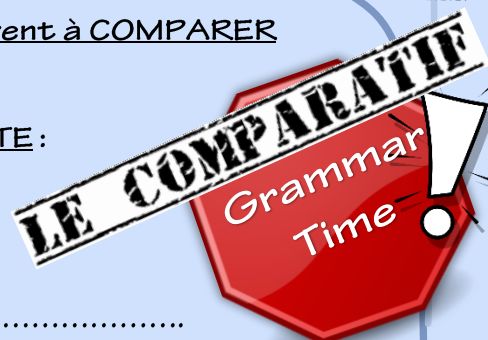
