In this procedure, stripping entails the removal of the diseased vein, which necessitates a few days in the hospital, a general anesthetic, and a lengthy, painful recovery period. Vein specialists do not use vein stripping very often these days. The Vein Institute's doctors use delicate, minimally invasive techniques that involve inserting a small catheter into the veins and using a laser or radiofrequency to seal and collapse the vein.

The procedure is exceedingly safe, and when a vein is closed, the deoxygenated blood is sent back to the heart and lungs via neighboring veins. The now-closed veins will fade away over several weeks. It is due to the excellent one-way blood flow. When you remove varicose veins, your overall circulation improves. It is because restoring one-way blood flow is essential for optimal health.



How can we get rid of varicose and spider veins?

- Compression therapy is a type of treatment that involves wearing tight stockings or socks to prevent blood from pooling in your leg's veins is a primary varicose vein treatment.
- VenaSeal. This high-tech medical glue plugs varicose veins and effectively redirects blood flow.
- Vein Ablations (endovenous ablation). It is a laser therapy in which they use laser energy to cauterize (burn) and seal your varicose veins, after which your body reroutes blood to a different vein.

- Microphlebectomy. It involves eliminating varicose veins by making small incisions in the skin.
- Ovarian vein embolization. Vein specialists use this treatment method on patients with varicose veins in their pelvic region. It includes sealing faulty veins.
