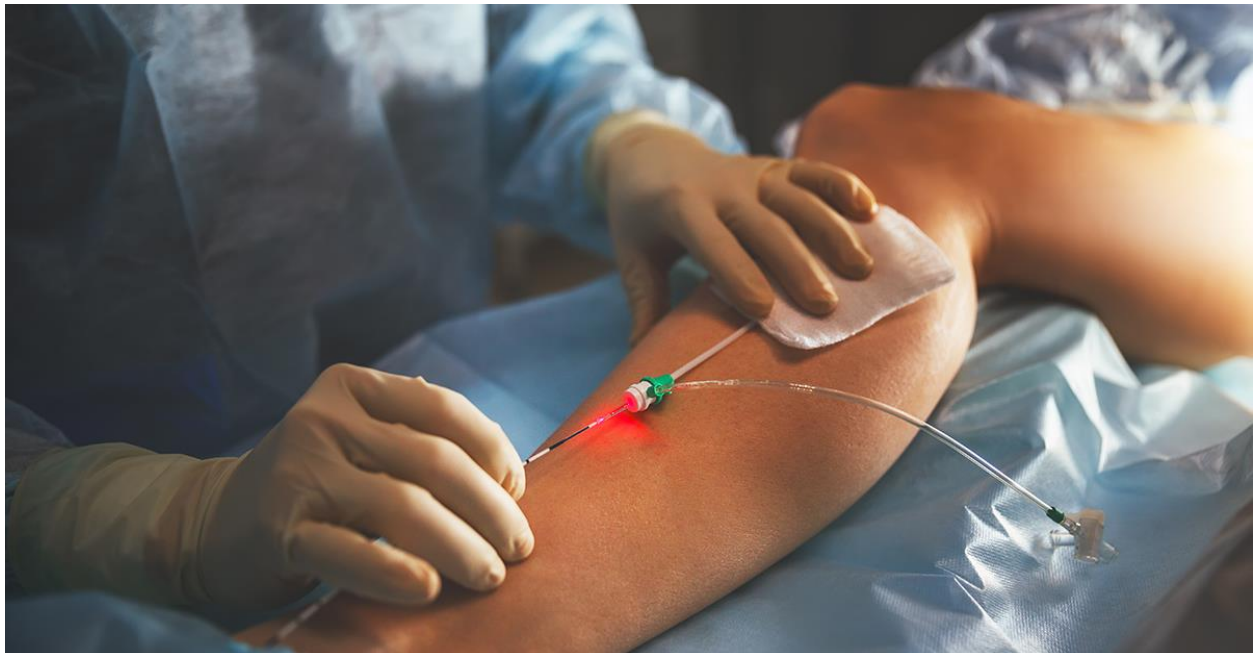

- Ligation and stripping. It is the surgical method that involves removing the varicose veins through surgery.
- Ablation. This method uses the heat with radiofrequency waves or lasers to destroy and ultimately close the veins.
