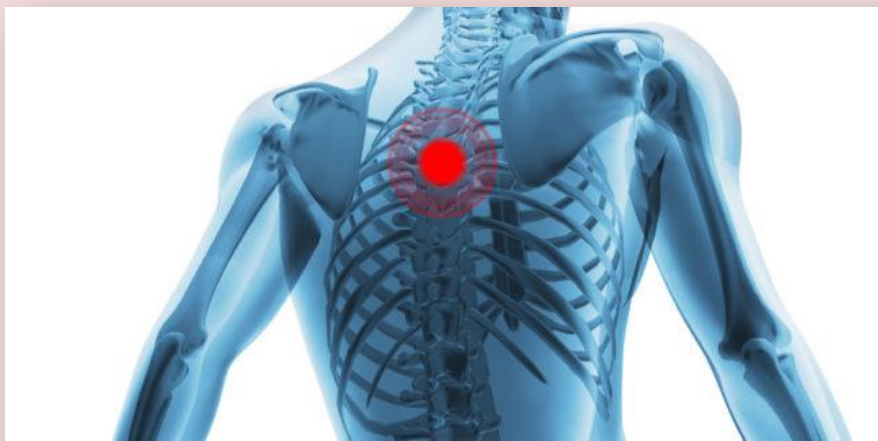


# When Should You Visit A Back Pain Doctor For Sciatica Pain Relief?

The more severe symptoms that may need treatment include:

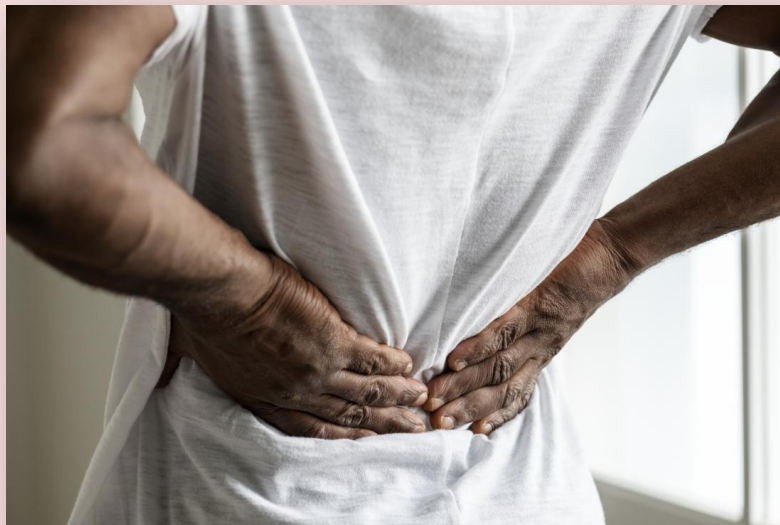
- Experiencing sudden, severe pain or weakness down to your leg.
