The president is the leader of the American government. The president suggests laws he or she the country needs. The president may work with the members of the U.S. Congress to get those ideas turned into laws.

The president appoints people to help run the government. The se people include judges and leaders of government departments. Often, the president's choices have to be approved by the U.S. Congress.

The president is commander-in-chief of the country's military. That means the president is responsible for the actions of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air force and Coast guard.
