Why is liposuction done?

- Chin and neck

- Chest and back
- Abdomen

Liposuction has dangers like bleeding and anesthetic reaction, just like any major surgery. The following are potential liposuction-specific side effects:

Abnormalities in the liposuction contour due to unequal fat removal, lack of skin elasticity, and atypical healing, your skin may appear bumpy, wavy, or withered. These modifications could be long-lasting.

The tiny tube (cannula) used during liposuction may cause damage beneath the skin, resulting in persistent spots on the skin.

Fluid encumbrance

Seromas, transient pockets of fluid, can develop beneath the skin, and a needle may be required to remove this fluid.

Numbness

The affected area may become temporarily or permanently numb. Additionally, the potential risk is transient nerve irritation.

Infection

Skin infections are sporadic but have chances. A severe skin infection may be life-threatening.

Internal puncture

Rarely a cannula penetrates too deep and may puncture the internal organ. This may require emergency repair from your surgeon.
